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Coronavirus and CWCF

We had to cancel all family events and close our caravan doors but we quickly adapted by moving our services online and over the telephone. We have continued responding to all new referrals sent from the Royal Marsden and other hospitals, as well as granting wishes whilst following government guidelines. We have also been working with the wonderful Green Fig Catering Company who have been delivering delicious meals to some of the families we support. The response we have had from this has been amazing and the meals definitely put a smile on the families' faces.

It feels very strange not being able to hold our family events and fundraisers but we are taking this time to plan lots of exciting events for our families in the future as well as coming up with some brand new activity ideas. During lockdown, we kept our families connected through our private family group on social media and sending them some virtual activities to do such as designing a CWCF Mascot!

Throughout lockdown our staff were Furloughed, apart from Shirley who has been a rock for our charity. We were very excited to surprise Shirley with a certificate presentation to thank her for all of the amazing work she has done for the charity and the families we support over lockdown. We were delighted that Mr Peter Field, Lord-Lieutenant of East Sussex could join us at the office and present Shirley with her certificate, flowers and a bottle of prosecco. Shirley had absolutely no idea about the presentation and was very much surprised! Thank you to our volunteers who also came out in the rain to watch the presentation (socially



distanced of course!), well done Shirley – you truly deserve it!

On the fundraising side of things, Zoe organised all of our fundraising supplies – which is a very big job indeed! Any of the items we had stored that were nearing their use by date were donated to the local NHS Care Packages. We are so pleased they went to good use. Unfortunately, we had to cancel all of our fundraising events but we have been lucky enough to have some successful online fundraisers including our raffle which raised £1.400.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all our supporters for your ongoing support, it has been a very difficult year for our charity but we are ready to bounce back with lots of family activities, fundraisers and reopen our caravans and office doors when it is safe to do so.

AIMS

Our aim is to grant wishes to children up to the age of eighteen, and their families, who have/have had cancer and who primarily live in East Sussex, Brighton and Hove. Wishes can be practical, medical or fun and made to individual families as well as supporting a group together by giving them quality family time. We can also support local hospitals/community nurses who assist in the care of the children under our remit.

ABOUT US

CWCF was formed in July 1998 and is a small group with the main thought being to enable the children, and families of the children with cancer, to have a quality of life that we would hope to have ourselves. Most of the time it means giving them treats or buying them something they have missed out on, normally due to the fact that their money has been spent fighting the illness or burning up petrol going to and fro to the hospital for treatment.

WISHES

Most of our referrals come directly to us through the community nurses and hospitals who are treating the child. After we have introduced ourselves we have a talk with the family about their wishes.

Over the years we have gone from strength to strength granting wishes such as laptops, trips, theatre breaks, football tickets, bedroom makeovers, providing cookers, dishwashers – the list goes on. In addition to individual wishes we now annually take a number of families away for a short break, over recent years to the Isle of Wight. We also have two 10-berth and one 6-berth caravans where families go on holiday, this as well as numerous outings for all our families, which, in particular gives them the opportunity to get together with others going through similar experiences and where they are able to build friendships and support networks.

However, the only reason we have been able to do this is because "you" the local community have supported us so well. But we say we get the best "bit", and that is the "bit" no money can buy: the granting of wishes. Sometimes a simple thing like a Lego kit has lit up the eyes of a child like having a million pounds could never do. But! We couldn't do it without you, so to all who read this a BIG, BIG THANK YOU from CWCF.

WHO WE ARE!

CWCF is a registered charity. We are supported by many, we are not religious based, yet we are supported by many of the local churches. We are not politically minded, yet all the various parties have made small donations in different ways. We are not directed by ourselves. We are directed by the wishes and guidance of the families and nurses that we support. BUT without your support we could not have that direction. INTRODUCTION TO NEW FAMILIES

When we receive a new referral, the first thing we do is to send the family an "Introductory Letter" about CWCF and with it we enclose our "Family Newsletter" which tells them all about our programme of events for the year. On top of this we also include a £50 voucher and, if appropriate, an annual parking permit for the Royal Marsden hospital in London.

Why do we respond in this way? The reason being is that when a family is told that their child has cancer their world falls apart. However, they still need to be able to get to the hospital, park the car, and the rest of the family still needs to eat and pay the bills. So, by doing what we do we have tried to cover some, if only a few, of the practicalities. The voucher can be used for petrol or food and the parking permit means that the family doesn't have to pay for some very expensive car parking charges.

The responses we had back when we first started doing this were very positive with a lot of "Thank You's" by way of e-mails and telephone calls, telling us how very useful this is.

We have therefore continued to give families this little boost to help them when they first need it.

This event is organised by James Gietzen and has grown every year since inception. It has a great balance of fear and motivation whilst raising money for charity. After over-indulging at Christmas, 30 friends took on the challenge of losing 10% of their body weight in three months together committing to a personal lifestyle change. Many also ditched alcohol along the way as well! Every participant was set their own end of challenge target weight. The rules were very simple, hit target weight every two weeks to avoid a fine. All proceeds from entry and some fines were being donated to a chosen charity.

A total of 225kg at an average of 7.5kg per person was lost



between all participants. The overall winner was Peter Henry losing a remarkable 15.9kg, an impressive 14.9% of his body weight. Runner-up was Ross Maryan losing 13.8kg 12.2%.

It was effort, motivation and peer group encouragement that played a large part in this event. Participants are all placed into teams. This year the team challenge went right to the wire, with only 0.6% splitting all six teams.

The 2019 winners were Uckfield College Teachers.

The weight challenge 2019 wanted to support a local charity this year and CWCF was something close to many participants hearts. As the organiser, who works in a large school, I work closely with families within my role, I have seen first hand daily struggles individuals and families go through dealing with cancer. I am really pleased that I have helped some of my larger friends lose weight and along the way we have raised £520 for this special charity.

CWCF TAKE ON THE O2

I wanted to share our journey over the past year and a half. Our son Elijah was diagnosed with cancer after we had discovered a lump on his belly. As you can imagine this is a world changing event.

I won't go into all the emotions and upheaval this causes however to say the whole family were in shock is an understatement. With so many hospital appointments having a knock-on effect on us all it was difficult to adjust and try to keep life as normal as possible for both of our boys.

Elijah was one when he was diagnosed and Jamil was three. We explained as best we could what was happening and what was likely to happen in the future. As there is no manual or parenting guide for this we didn't know how much the boys had understood or taken in.

This is when we were contacted by the Children with Cancer Fund charity. They were a godsend. They introduced us



to families that were going through or had been through the process. This helped us and prepared us for what was to come. They provided practical and emotional support throughout our journey and were always available if we needed them. They gave our boys joy in an otherwise dark period of their lives by providing them with wishes. Elijah chose

an electric car which he had taken a liking to in hospital. He absolutely loves it and drives it in and out of the house.

He can become upset when the battery runs out but still sits in it and plays with the steering wheel.

It gave us lots of smiles when we badly needed to smile. Jamil chose to go to Peppa Pig World.

This was a great day the whole family enjoyed and provided memories that we will never forget.

I cannot stress enough the importance and impact the charity has had on all of our lives.

They allowed us to have fun, support, love, cry and laugh like any other family. We will always support them in their fantastic vital work and hope you all do as well. Elijah had chemo followed by an operation and was declared cancer free late in 2019. We will never forget the highs and lows and the wonderful people we met along the way.

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
