The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED]:

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On May 5, 1994, Kansas City SAC was apprised of the following facts in the case; namely, he was advised that Kansas City's investigation revealed that the victims did not sustain any injuries at the time of their arrest, [REDACTED] that were consistent with their statements of being severely beaten by the arresting officers. Additional witnesses that the victims say can substantiate their version of the beatings have refused to make themselves available for interviews by the FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.

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At the conclusion of these facts, SAC recommended that this case be closed administratively without further investigation.

On January 21, 1994, [] was interviewed at WYANDOTTE COUNTY JAIL, Kansas City, Kansas, by Special Agent (SA) []. Prior to the interview, SA [] identified himself by the show of credentials. Also [] was being interviewed regarding a police brutality complaint, which was filed by his mother, [] on his behalf on January 14, 1994.

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As such, [] advised that he and [] were arrested around 7:00 p.m. on [] by about ten Kansas City, Kansas police officers. [] advised that at no time of the arrest did the officers tell him what he was being arrested for; however, about two days later, he was interviewed in the jail by a Kansas City, Kansas detective, who told him that the charges he was arrested on consisted of Aggravated Assault and Burglary Theft.

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At the time of the arrest, [] stated he was riding as a passenger with [] who lives on [] and lives near the area where the arrest took place, which was at the intersection of 31st and Parallel in Kansas City, Kansas. The car that they were occupying when the arrest took place was a small yellow car and he thinks the car was possibly a Datsun. Also, he was told by [] that he [] had rented the car.

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[] advised he first noticed police following them at about eighteenth and Wood Street in Kansas City, Kansas; however, [] continued to drive at a regular speed until he reached the intersection of 31st and Parallel, where police forced them to stop by sandwiching the car that he was riding in between two police cars.

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Shortly after the car was stopped, [REDACTED] stated that a group of police officers grabbed him, jerked him out of the car, and placed him face down on the ground, at which point, he was hit on his face and other body parts with the officers' night sticks and flashlights. He also was kicked on all parts of his body by the arresting officers. While on the ground, [REDACTED] stated he was handcuffed with his hands behind his back. Cuffs were placed so tightly around his wrist that they continue to cause him great pain. After he was cuffed, an officer grabbed the cuffs in the center and jerked him from the ground onto his feet, which caused him a great deal of pain. He was then escorted to the police wagon where the officers pushed him very hard to the rear of the wagon. He stated that he was later joined in the wagon by [REDACTED] as he had also been arrested. [REDACTED] stated that at the point that he was placed in the wagon, he had been beaten so bad near the calf of his right leg that it was almost impossible for him to walk. Also, he said his face and eyes were very swollen.

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[REDACTED] then recalled that the police then drove them to another location, which he estimated it took about five minutes to arrive. Then the officers stopped the wagon, opened their rear door and jerked [REDACTED] from the wagon. As they pulled [REDACTED] from the wagon, [REDACTED] heard one of the officers make the remark, "Let's hang him." [REDACTED] then saw the officers beating [REDACTED] with their nightsticks and flashlights. The officers also were observed to be kicking [REDACTED] on all parts of his body. [REDACTED] advised that he heard [REDACTED] screaming as if he was in great pain as the officers continued to beat him. [REDACTED] advised that after the beating, the officers then placed [REDACTED] back into the wagon where they drove the two of them back to the scene of the initial arrest. Nothing happened insofar as them being beaten by the officers at the scene of the initial arrest on the second occasion. After being at the scene of the arrest for a short period of time, they were then taken to the WYANDOTTE COUNTY JAIL.

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After arriving at the jail, [REDACTED] recalled that he was seen by a male nurse before he was booked into the jail. The nurse tried to check his injuries, however, he [REDACTED] was hurting so badly that it was impossible for the nurse to check him. After being in the jail for a short time, [REDACTED] advised that he was then examined by a female nurse who told him that he had broken tissue in the calf of his leg; however, the nurse

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advised him that she felt that his leg would heal in a couple of days, as well as she felt that the swelling would also go down in a couple of days. The nurse did not give him any type of medication because she did not feel that his injuries were serious enough for any type of medication. [REDACTED] advised that he did request that the nurse give him an ice pack to put on his swollen body parts, however, she did not feel it was necessary to do so.

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[REDACTED] stated that all of the officers involved in the beating were white, except one who looked to be Hispanic. He did not know the identity of the officers involved in the beating other than he recognized two of the officers as being two individuals who are known on the streets as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] felt that he could identify the officers if he saw them again.

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[REDACTED] advised that the arrest took place fairly close to his and [REDACTED] residence. At the scene of the arrest, he observed his mother, his uncle, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] cousin, [REDACTED] at the scene of the arrest. These individuals should possibly be able to provide information to the FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION (FBI) regarding the beatings. He also advised that there were other individuals, whom he did not recognize, at the scene of the arrest.

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[REDACTED] advised that even though the arrest took place around 7:00 p.m. in the evening, and at a time when it was fairly dark, the arrest and beatings took place in fairly lighted areas, which made it fairly easy to see what was going on.

[redacted] was interviewed at the Wyandotte County Jail, Kansas City, Kansas, by Special Agent (SA) [redacted]. Prior to the interview, SA [redacted] identified himself by the show of credentials. Also, [redacted] was being interviewed regarding a police brutality matter which came about after an interview with [redacted] which occurred at the jail on [redacted]. As such, [redacted] advised that he was driving a borrowed car on [redacted] with [redacted] as a passenger, in the general area of 18th and Wood, Kansas City, Kansas, when he observed a police car following them. [redacted] stated that he borrowed the car from an individual known only to him as [redacted] and they initially took possession of the car in the general area of 13th and Garfield, after paying the owner \$20 to rent the vehicle. [redacted] described the car as being an older-model Buick.

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[redacted] advised that at the point he observed the police car following him, he immediately started driving toward his residence, [redacted] so as to be closer to his home in case he was arrested by the police, and so as to be closer to witnesses when and if an arrest took place.

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At about 30th and Parallel, Kansas City, Kansas, [redacted] stated that the police pulled them over. [redacted] advised that the officer immediately ran up beside the door where he was located, opened the door, grabbed him out of the vehicle, and slammed him face down on the ground. The slam caused him great pain and caused a great deal of pain to his right hand which was in a cast. He stated the cast was placed on his hand as a result of a previous fight he had with some other individual.

The officer continued to grab the center of the cuffs and, he pulled on the cuffs very hard as if he was trying to lift him from the ground. However, the officer stopped short of lifting him from the ground, and the lifting motion by the officer was causing him tremendous pain and agony.

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[REDACTED] advised that while he was on the ground, he asked the officers what were the charges, at which time they informed him that he was being arrested for being in possession of stolen property, namely, being in possession of a stolen car. [REDACTED] stated that he advised the officers at that time that he was unaware that the vehicle was stolen and that he could prove this by locating the person from whom he obtained the car, and this person should be in the general area of 13th and Garfield, Kansas City, Kansas.

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[REDACTED] stated he was later removed from the ground and placed in the center compartment of a Kansas City, Kansas police van. He also observed at that time that [REDACTED] had been arrested and had been placed in the rear compartment of the same van.

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[REDACTED] recalled that they were then driven from the arrest scene to an area near YOUNG'S MARKET which is located near 29th and Wood, Kansas City, Kansas. The officer driving the van and an officer who was in a patrol car approached the side of the van where he was located and proceeded to open the door. They then snatched him from the van. As the officers removed him from the van [REDACTED] advised that they asked him if he had anything on him. [REDACTED] advised that at the scene of the arrest, he does not recall that the officers had given him a thorough search for any weapons he might have had on him. [REDACTED] stated that during the search by the officers, they located a marijuana pipe which he had in one of his coat pockets. [REDACTED] advised that the officer slammed him on the ground face down so hard the first time that it almost knocked the breath from his body. Additionally, he recalled being slammed to the ground on three or four more occasions. [REDACTED] advised that he sustained two small cuts above his eyes during the time the officers were slamming him against the ground. He described the cut marks as not being too severe and being similar to what a person would get from sliding a short distance on concrete.

They were only at the arrest scene a short time on the second occasion, and afterwards, they were driven to the Wyandotte County Jail where he and [REDACTED] were booked into the jail.

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[REDACTED] advised that at no time during his contact with the police officers did they hit him with their night sticks or flashlights, nor at any time did the officers hit him with their fists or kick him with their feet.

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[REDACTED] stated that the officer who was driving the van was the individual who placed the handcuffs on him. However, a second officer who was in a patrol car also assisted the officer driving the van at the scene of the arrest. Also, [REDACTED] advised that the officer in the patrol car was the same officer who assisted the officer driving in the van in the search which took place near YOUNG'S MARKET. [REDACTED] did not know the names of the officers and was only able to describe the officer who was driving the police van as being a white officer who was tall and medium-sized with a funny haircut, as his hair was cut very close on the sides. [REDACTED] described the officer in the patrol car as being a white officer who was short, heavy-set, with short hair and a mustache. [REDACTED] advised that he felt he could identify the officers if he saw them again.

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[REDACTED] advised that at the scene of the arrest, he observed as onlookers his cousin [REDACTED] his uncle, [REDACTED] and possibly [REDACTED] and numerous other onlookers whom he did not recognize.

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[REDACTED] stated that the arrest took place around 7:00 p.m., and it was fairly dark as the arrest took place. He also recalled that light snow was falling at the time of the arrest.

Synopsis:

This case was predicated upon a complaint from victim, [REDACTED] mother, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] indicated her son was arrested on [REDACTED] [REDACTED] by police officers of the KANSAS CITY, KANSAS POLICE DEPARTMENT (KCKPD) and in the process of the arrest he was beaten without provocation by the officers. [REDACTED] advised that this situation concerned her even more so because it was the second time that her son has been arrested and beaten by officers of the KCKPD. [REDACTED] was interviewed on January 21, 1994 and advised he was arrested [REDACTED] along with is friend [REDACTED] [REDACTED] by KCKPD officers. [REDACTED] advised the arrest took place as he was riding as a passenger in a vehicle that was being operated by [REDACTED] He stated the vehicle had been borrowed by [REDACTED] by one of [REDACTED] friends. [REDACTED] stated at the scene of the arrest that he was basically beaten on all parts of his body by the arresting officers with their nightsticks and flashlights. Additionally, he stated the officers kicked him all over his body. He stated he and [REDACTED] were then transported from the arrest scene together in a police van to a second location. At this second location, [REDACTED] observed the officers pull [REDACTED] from the van. According to [REDACTED] was then beaten by the officers with their flashlights and nightsticks. Also, the officers kicked [REDACTED] on all parts of his body. [REDACTED] advised his injuries consisted of a

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very swollen calf on his right leg and his face and eyes were also swollen from the beating that he received by the police officers. According to [redacted] his injuries did not require, nor did he request, hospitalization for the injuries. He stated he saw a nurse upon his arrival at the jail; however, the nurse did not feel that his injuries were severe enough to see a doctor.

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On February 9, 1994, [redacted] was interviewed and advised he was arrested on [redacted] by KCKPD officers. He stated at the time of the arrest he was the driver of a vehicle that was occupied by [redacted] stated that the vehicle that was being driven by [redacted] and him had been rented for \$20 from a friend only known to them as [redacted] stated that at the scene of the arrest he was slammed face down on the ground by the arresting officers. According to [redacted] the slam caused him a great deal of pain, and as a result of the slam [redacted] stated he injured his right hand which was in a cast from a previous fight he had with someone else. [redacted] stated he was then placed in a police van along with [redacted] The two of them were then driven to a second location. At this location, the police removed him from the van where they conducted a thorough search for weapons. In the process of conducting this search, [redacted] advised he was slammed to the ground on two or three occasions by the police officers. As a result of these slams to the ground, [redacted] stated he received two cut marks above his eyes. The cuts did not require any medical treatment or hospitalization. [redacted] is positive that he was never hit by the police officers with their nightsticks or flashlights. Additionally, he denied that the arresting officers ever kicked him during the arrest.

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A review of the police records pertaining to this incident revealed that [redacted] was charged in connection with the incident for being in possession of stolen property, resisting arrest and obstruction. [redacted] was charged for possession of a firearm and possession of stolen property.

[REDACTED] advised that he sustained two small cuts above his eyes during the time the officers were slamming him against the ground. He described the cut marks as not being too severe and being similar to what a person would get from sliding a short distance on concrete.

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[REDACTED] advised that he was later placed back into the van and transported back to the scene of the arrest. 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[REDACTED] advised that at no time during his contact with the police officers did they hit him with their night sticks or flashlights, nor at any time did the officers hit him with their fists or kick him with their feet.

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[REDACTED] stated that the officer who was driving the van was the individual who placed the handcuffs on him. However, a second officer who was in a patrol car also assisted the officer driving the van at the scene of the arrest. Also [REDACTED] advised that the officer in the patrol car was the same officer who assisted the officer driving in the van in the search which took place near YOUNG'S MARKET. [REDACTED] did not know the names of the officers and was only able to describe the officer who was driving the police van as being a white officer who was tall and medium-sized with a funny haircut, as his hair was cut very close on the sides. [REDACTED] described the officer in the patrol car as being a white officer who was short, heavy-set, with short hair and a mustache. [REDACTED] advised that he felt he could identify the officers if he saw them again.

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[REDACTED] advised that at the scene of the arrest, he observed as onlookers his cousin [REDACTED], his uncle, [REDACTED] and possibly [REDACTED] and numerous other onlookers whom he did not recognize.

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[REDACTED] stated that the arrest took place around 7:00 p.m., and it was fairly dark as the arrest took place. He also recalled that light snow was falling at the time of the arrest.

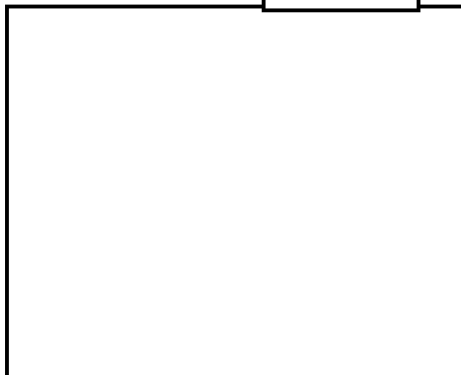

Medical records obtained from Wyandotte County Jail medical staff revealed that [REDACTED] had a minor superficial wound on his left leg when he was booked into the jail on [REDACTED]. The record revealed that the wound was not serious enough to have the victim seen by a doctor. An interview with Kansas City, Kansas police officer who is a subject in the case revealed that the victims were arrested for carjacking and being in possession of a firearm. According to the officer, the victims were not abused in any way by the arresting officers, and had the victims sustained any injuries at the scene of the arrest, they would have had to be taken directly to the hospital instead of being taken directly to Wyandotte County Jail, as was the case with the arrestees. Two of the subjects in the case refused to contact the Kansas City FBI office in order for them to be interviewed. Attempts to contact witnesses to the alleged police brutality were met with negative results on March 31, 1994, April 20, 1994 and April 25, 1994. Case is being closed by Kansas City based on the opinion of the SAC.

DEPARTMENT (KCKPD) Officer [redacted]

[redacted] was interviewed by Special Agent (SA) [redacted]
[redacted] Prior to the interview, SA [redacted] identified himself
by the show of credentials. Also, prior to the interview, SA
[redacted] explained to Officer [redacted] that he wished to interview him
about being the subject of a civil rights violation wherein he
was being accused by [redacted] of
committing police brutality on them during the time they were
arrested on [redacted]. Officer [redacted] was advised by SA
[redacted] that the brutality allegedly consist of himself, Officer

Officer [redacted] advised that he did not wish to give a
detailed statement of what occurred in connection with the arrest

advise that he recalled the arrest taking place and his
participation in the arrest. Additionally, Officer [redacted] advised
that neither [redacted] were beaten or abused by himself or
any of the other officers who participated in the arrest.

Officer [redacted] advised that he recalled that the
incident occurred in connection with a carjacking and in
connection with one of the victims being in possession of a
firearm.

Additionally, Officer [redacted] stated that the victims
were taken directly from the crime scene to the Wyandotte County
Jail where they were booked into the jail for carjacking and
being in possession of a firearm. He also stated that both
victims were released to jail officials and neither of them at
that time had any bruises or injuries of any kind. Officer [redacted]
stated that it is jail policy that if the arrestees have any
bruises or injuries at the time of the arrest, then the

hospital in order for them to be treated by a doctor before they can be released to Wyandotte County Jail officials.

Officer [redacted] stated that neither [redacted] were taken to the hospital after their arrest which indicates to him that neither of these individuals sustained any bruises or injuries during the time that they were arrested. Additionally, Officer [redacted] stated that he does not recall either [redacted] making any requests of the arresting officers that they be taken for treatment by a doctor. b6 b7C

Officer [redacted] stated that this is all that he recalls in connection with the arrest of [redacted] and therefore he did not wish to comment further regarding the matter. b6 b7C

On March 31, 1994, [REDACTED] was contacted at his residence, [REDACTED] by Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED] was being contacted regarding the whereabouts of [REDACTED] who are allegedly witnesses to a police brutality matter wherein [REDACTED] were the victims. [REDACTED] advised that neither [REDACTED] was at home at that time; however, he took SA [REDACTED] business card and advised that he would have the two contact SA [REDACTED] later that afternoon.

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[REDACTED] stated he recalled the incident of the beating of the aforementioned victims and the incident only took place about one block from his residence, [REDACTED] however, he did not personally witness the incident.

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On April 20, 1994, [redacted] who is victim [redacted] mother, telephonically (telephone number [redacted]) contacted Special Agent (SA) [redacted] and wanted to know the status of the FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION's (FBI) investigation of her son being beaten by KANSAS CITY, KANSAS POLICE DEPARTMENT Officers during his arrest on [redacted]

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SA [redacted] advised [redacted] that the FBI's investigation was continuing; however, the matter that was somewhat complicating the investigation dealt with [redacted] and [redacted] refusal to contact the FBI for interviews as alleged witnesses to the beating. Additionally, [redacted] was advised by SA [redacted] that several negative attempts had been made to interview the [redacted]

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[redacted] advised that she was a family friend of the [redacted] and that she would contact them today and request that they contact SA [redacted] for interview regarding what they saw on [redacted]

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On April 25, 1994, Special Agent (SA) [redacted] visited the residence at [redacted] of [redacted] where he observed that no one was home. SA [redacted] left his business card along with a message for the [redacted] to call him regarding setting up appointments for interviews.

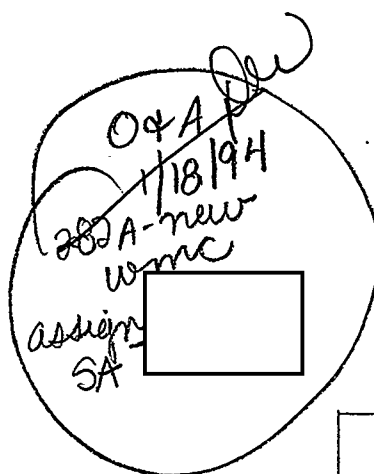
