Facts of complaint

Complainant alleges that on [redacted] several Kansas City, Kansas police officers entered his home and used excessive force to remove him from his home. The officers had accompanied Complainant's wife to Complainant's home to remove her belongings. The previous evening, Complainant and his wife had a fight and they decided that she would move out of the home.

Complainant alleges that he was sleeping when the officers came into his home. The officers allegedly pull him out of bed, swore at him, slammed his head against the floor and then hogtied him and took him to the station. He was held for approximately six hours but was not charged with anything. The officers originally told Complainant that he was going to be charged with assault. Complainant said that during the confrontation with the police at his home, he believes he defended himself, but does not remember specifics because of the blow to his head. Complainant is a disabled veteran. He believes that he suffered significant injury as a result of the arrest.

Complainant also alleged that while he was held in jail, a uniformed police officer kicked in his back door and ransacked his home. Complainant took pictures of the damaged door and the ransacked room. Complainant can provide a witness who observed the officer break into Complainant's home.

Complainant said that he had a fairly good relationship with

They picked him up by biceps and wrists to lift him - but he was big so maybe this how they had to pick him up.

They walked him to van - took handcuffs off & let him shake his arms. Then put cuffs on & put him in van. He wanted to go to bathroom - they said

no. Then they left. . . So they wd keep him for 6 hrs.
Not sure why he was arrested.

Didn't hear anything while she was outside,
while they handcuffed him - knew there was an

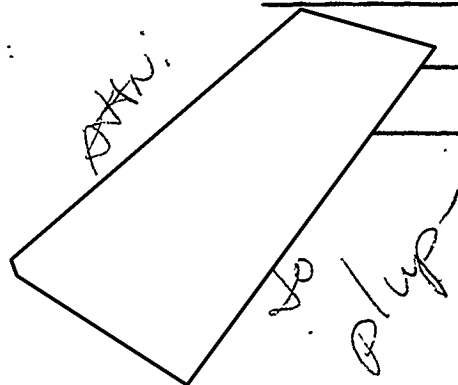

The purpose of this letter is concerning a federal civil rights investigation the Federal Bureau of Investigation initiated (FBI) during May 1997, in which [REDACTED] alleged the captioned officers of the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department dragged him out of his bed, hit his head on the floor, and handled him roughly before his arrest on [REDACTED] alleged injuries included a sore shoulder and a broken finger.

During the investigation, the Kansas City Division of the FBI received copies of the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department Internal Affairs Report, a copy of a video tape that consisted of a segment of the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department officers doing intake procedures of [REDACTED] behavior, and a copy of medical records obtained from the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Kansas City, Kansas.

Guidance

On April 10, 1998, the Kansas City Division of the FBI received a confirmation from the U.S. Department of Justice, which has final disposition on all civil rights matters, that the Department of Justice cannot prove a federal civil rights violation because there is insufficient evidence to prove officer [redacted] criminal intent, with insufficient evidence to prove they used excessive force against [redacted]. Therefore, the Department of Justice and the FBI have closed this matter.

[redacted] was angry with her because she returned home late. [redacted] was not acting "like his normal self" so [redacted] sat down to watch television. [redacted] was still angry so he called the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department (KCKPD) and complained of a domestic dispute. [redacted] continued to watch television. [redacted] was informed that he could not cancel the report and that an officer was on his way to their home.

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[redacted] remained "aggravated" and called the police again to ask them not to come. [redacted] told him to stop calling the police because they were probably getting annoyed with him. [redacted] remained in the living room, watching television during this time. [redacted] is aware that [redacted] said she hit him that evening; this is untrue. At no time during the evening did she hit him.

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Several police cars arrived at the [redacted] home. [redacted] asked the police to leave. The police officers said that because this was a domestic dispute, [redacted] would have to either leave home for the evening or go to jail, where she would be held for six hours. [redacted] chose to leave home and decided to go to her daughter's apartment. [redacted] wanted to take her car but [redacted] absolutely refused to allow her to take her car.

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Later that evening, [redacted] called [redacted] at her daughter's home and said that he was going to have her car towed. 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called the towing company and instructed them not to tow the car as it was on private property, was properly registered and had appropriate tags.

[REDACTED] then decided to pick up the car herself. She believes that it was approximately 2:30 or 3:00 a.m. before she went to pick up the car. [REDACTED] called the police and told them that she was going back to her home to pick up her car. Two officers accompanied her back to her home. As she was backing out of the driveway, [REDACTED] came out of the house and threw a wrench at the car, shattering the windshield. [REDACTED] continued to back out of the driveway. The police approached [REDACTED] and followed him to the back door. [REDACTED] did not see or hear what happened next because she had backed up to the front of the driveway and the house was obstructing her view. 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[REDACTED] assumed that [REDACTED] would be awake when they arrived. However, when they arrived, [REDACTED] knocked but [REDACTED] did not answer. She decided to use her key to get in the back door, which is the basement entrance. When she attempted to use the key, [REDACTED] noticed that the doorway was partially obstructed by a damaged bolt. The door had been broken and she saw pieces of the door on the basement floor. [REDACTED] decided to go in the front door due to the condition of the door. She went to the front door, accompanied by the police officers, and knocked for several minutes. She was concerned because [REDACTED] did not answer the door. After waiting several minutes, she instructed the police officers to break the latch on the door.

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When they entered the house, [REDACTED] did not wake up.

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With the help of the movers and her friends, [REDACTED] began taking her belongings outside to load them onto a moving truck. At one point, [REDACTED] was standing in the kitchen with the two police officers. The officers went into [REDACTED] bedroom and she heard them say, "Wake up, [REDACTED]" She heard a sound that resembled a light slapping of his arm or cheek, as if to try to wake him up. [REDACTED] instructed the police officers to let [REDACTED] sleep and that she did not need anything in that room. [REDACTED] then went outside to the front yard to load her belongings into the truck. She had been in the house approximately thirty minutes.

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As she was standing outside, [REDACTED] heard [REDACTED] yelling her name. He was standing outside on the sidewalk in front of their house. [REDACTED] could tell that he was disoriented because they had just woken him up. There was a police officer on each side of [REDACTED] standing about one to two feet behind him. Additionally, there was one officer standing beside him. [REDACTED] then saw [REDACTED] lift both of his arms above his head. She explained that [REDACTED] lifts his arms in this manner because he has had surgery on his arms and experiences a lot of pain. As a way to relieve the pain, he often lifts his arms above his head as if to stretch them.

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At this point, both officers grabbed [REDACTED] arms, took him down to the ground and handcuffed him. The officers sat [REDACTED] down on the sidewalk and he started to roll around. He rolled onto his back while he was still cuffed. He was yelling, [REDACTED] help me, they are hurting my shoulders."

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[REDACTED] does not believe that the police officers realized that they were hurting [REDACTED] when they handcuffed him. She also said that when he raised both arms, the officers might have thought he was raising his arms at them.

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One of the police officers approached [REDACTED] and asked her if [REDACTED] recently had surgery. The officer wanted to confirm what [REDACTED] told them; that he had surgery and his arms were hurting. [REDACTED] told the officer that [REDACTED] had surgery approximately six months ago. The officer told her that [REDACTED] would be alright.

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The police officers called a van to transport [REDACTED] to the police station. When the van arrived, the officers stood on

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either side of [REDACTED] and picked him up by his biceps and wrists to lift him off the ground. [REDACTED] thought that they picked him up this way because he was so big and they had trouble lifting him. 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[REDACTED] could not see what happened while the police officers were walking [REDACTED] to the van because she was standing in front of the van. [REDACTED] told the officers that he needed to go to the bathroom, but the officers would not allow him to use the bathroom. They put him in the van and left for the police station. The officers told [REDACTED] that they would keep [REDACTED] for six hours.

[REDACTED] did not see anything that happened while the officers were in [REDACTED] bedroom. [REDACTED] was already outside when they brought [REDACTED] outside. [REDACTED] could hear an exchange of words between the police officers and [REDACTED] but could not tell exactly what they were saying. [REDACTED] seemed shocked and acted like he could not believe what was happening. He also seemed as if he was not quite awake. [REDACTED] thinks that [REDACTED] did not really expect her to move and therefore was fairly upset by the circumstances.

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[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] was angry, but she thinks that the police officers could have talked to him to calm him down rather than handcuff him. Otherwise, [REDACTED] did not see any conduct by the officers which she would characterize as excessive. She did not see any conduct that occurred in the house.

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[REDACTED] noted that while in the house, one police officer asked her why [REDACTED] had radios in his back room/office. The police officers did not go into [REDACTED] office while they were removing her property. [REDACTED] is not aware of anything being removed or disturbed in [REDACTED] office. In addition to the police officers, the following individuals were in her house helping her to move: two movers, her daughter, a friend, and her daughter's boyfriend.

On [redacted] [redacted] had a domestic dispute. [redacted] returned home late that evening at approximately 11:00 p.m. Her late return caused an argument. During the course of the argument [redacted] hit [redacted] called the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department (KCKPD) to report the assault. [redacted] then changed his mind and called the KCKPD to "cancel" his report. However, within a few minutes Officer [redacted] KCKPD, came to the [redacted] home. Other officers accompanied Officer [redacted] but [redacted] requested that only Officer [redacted] come into the house and that the other officers remain outside. Officer [redacted] agreed and entered the house by himself. [redacted] had been acquainted with Officer [redacted] prior to this incident.

[redacted] asked Officer [redacted] to speak with [redacted] and tell her not to hit him or physically assault him anymore. Officer [redacted] checked both parties for evidence of assault and determined that [redacted] had been hit by [redacted] and that [redacted] had not been hit by [redacted]. Officer [redacted] said that he had to take [redacted] to the station and hold her for six hours, explaining that this is the procedure for domestic dispute situations. Because [redacted] knew Officer [redacted] he requested that [redacted] be permitted to stay at home. Officer [redacted] gave [redacted] the option of going to the police station for six hours or leaving the house for the evening. [redacted] decided that she would spend the evening at her daughter's apartment.

After [redacted] left, [redacted] decided that he had "had enough" and that he was going to file for divorce. He moved [redacted] belongings out of the house and into the front yard. He called a tow truck company to remove her car from their driveway.

Later that night, after [redacted] had gone to bed, he was

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awakened by the sound of a car motor. He got up and saw that someone was trying to take [redacted] car out of the driveway. [redacted] thought that the driver was one of [redacted] daughters' friends, a "punk," in his opinion. [redacted] got up and threw "something" at the car. [redacted] does not remember what he threw at the car. He then returned to bed.

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The next morning, at approximately 10:30 a.m., [redacted] heard voices in the house. He was still in bed at this time. He heard a male voice say, "Mr. [redacted] get up." He heard [redacted] saying, "If he's asleep, let him alone, I don't need anything in there [the bedroom]." [redacted] heard the officer ask [redacted] to step outside. Two officers came into [redacted] bedroom and dragged him out of bed, kicked him, and hit his head on the floor. [redacted] repeatedly asked the officers why they were doing this to him. The officers grabbed [redacted] by his arms and elbows and dragged him to the front door. Before they got to the door, they shoved him to the floor head first.

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[redacted] was in severe pain because the officers aggravated prior injuries that he sustained in Vietnam and in an unrelated accident. [redacted] has had surgery on his arms and neck to try to correct these injuries. As a result of the pain that he was feeling, [redacted] lifted one arm above his head. [redacted] doctor told him to do this stretch to relieve the pain in his arms.

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When [redacted] raised his arm, the officers "attacked" him. [redacted] first stated that the officers beat him up, however, he then clarified his statement by saying they treated him very roughly when they handcuffed him and put him in the "paddy wagon." They cuffed him initially, then removed the cuffs so he could shake his arms, then cuffed him again, this time across the bones on his wrists. They threw him into the paddy wagon and took him for "the ride." [redacted] described "the ride" as deliberately driving in such a way as to throw him back and forth inside of the van. [redacted] was taken to the Kansas City jail where he was held for six hours. He was released at approximately 6:00 p.m. on [redacted]

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When [redacted] returned home after being released from jail, he noticed that his back door had been kicked in and his office had been ransacked. His desk drawers were pulled open and

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his computer had been "messed with." It has not worked properly since this incident. [REDACTED] spoke with one of his neighbors, [REDACTED] (phonetic), who lives across the street from [REDACTED] house at [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that after [REDACTED] was arrested and removed from the scene, a police officer walked around to the back of [REDACTED] house. [REDACTED] could not see what the officer was doing. When the officer returned to the front of the house, he asked [REDACTED] if he had seen [REDACTED] believes that this officer broke into his house and "ransacked" his office.

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[REDACTED] said that the KCKPD Internal Affairs Division has been investigating this matter. [REDACTED] gave photographs of his office and back door to Detective [REDACTED] KCKPD. Additionally, following [REDACTED] claim that his office had been ransacked, [REDACTED] (phonetic), looked at [REDACTED] office. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] is a supervisor. 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[REDACTED] suffered several injuries as a result of the arrest. [REDACTED] left ring finger was broken. [REDACTED] left ankle and shin were bruised and scraped. [REDACTED] right arm and elbow were reinjured and his left elbow and left hand are numb. [REDACTED] had to start taking his pain medication again, however, he is feeling better now that a few weeks have passed since the incident.

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[REDACTED] later learned from [REDACTED] that she had been the person who was trying to take the car from their driveway. [REDACTED] learned that he was charged with aggravated battery for throwing the unidentified object at the car while [REDACTED] was trying to leave the driveway. Additionally, [REDACTED] was charged with battery against a law enforcement officer and with battery against another individual, however, [REDACTED] did not know the individual. [REDACTED] said that he was not given a court date nor did he receive a citation for these charges. He believes the charges are being "held" and may be dismissed because of the investigation of the police conduct by the Internal Affairs Division.

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[REDACTED] said that he drank approximately one half of a beer the afternoon preceding the arrest. [REDACTED] said that he does not usually drink and never uses any illegal drugs.

Additionally, [REDACTED] did not believe that the beer had a negative reaction with any of the prescription drugs he had been taking. He said he did not feel "out of sorts."

[REDACTED] initially stated that he believed the attack may have been racially motivated. His wife's ex-husband was affiliated with a militia and was racist. Certain black officers in the KCKPD may have associated [REDACTED] with his wife's ex-husband. Additionally, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Certain officers on the KCKPD have made statements that the Gang Intervention Team is a racist organization.

[REDACTED] has received many awards and certificates for his community service. He has many connections with different political and police officials and is surprised that he was treated with such hostility by the police officers.

[REDACTED] believes that a crowd of people witnessed his arrest. However, none of his neighbors claim to have seen the arrest. [REDACTED] also witnessed the arrest and she is willing to discuss the incident. [REDACTED] has moved back into [REDACTED] home and they are working out their marital problems.

[REDACTED] works for the [REDACTED] believes that she may have given information to KCKPD officers or disseminated information regarding the time and place of the arrest. [REDACTED] does not get along well with his step-daughters.
