



A goal for the Summer Bridge program was to ensure students were corequisite ready.

How was this done in Math and English?

Mathematics Delivery


- A work group was formed and topics essential for students to be corequisite ready were mapped out.
- A course was created in EdReady where students were able to practice these skills.
- We met for 75-minutes 4 days a week. Instruction was broken up into lecture, in class practice and time spent in EdReady.
- Students took a pre and post test. The instructor used results to look for increased mastery.
- EdReady's built in "Learn" feature was an excellent supplement to in class lecture. It provided students with additional opportunities to master content based on individual learning styles.


English Delivery

- Student Connection was formed through small groups. Each group was given time to speak with the instructor to meet the needs of students on an individual basis.
- Interactive Education Experience was created through the lessons EdReady provides.
 Students were able to work with materials in a way that was flexible to each learning style.
- Self-evaluation was completed by students through use of grammar and mechanics materials that provided assessment, and metacognitive questions.




