Letter from the director

If you are reading this, it is most likely that you are associated with the mission of bringing faith in Jesus to young people in Ireland, which we call NET Ministries. This is our 19th year of mission in this beautiful country. Roughly 200,00 young people have heard about Jesus, the Carpenter, who also happens to be God, who chose freely to die for us, since the first missionaries arrived here in 2004.

Every year we build on what has gone the year before. Despite all the setbacks associated with culture and covid, NET Missionaries continued to reach the young people with the Gospel of Jesus. The reality is that most meetings were not a chance encounter but a prolonged discipleship experience.

It most likely was the first time that a young Irish person met another young person who believed in Jesus enough to want to offer a year of their lives to Him. Young people need Jesus more than ever and as Saint Paul says in Romans:

They will not believe in Him unless they have heard of Him. The footsteps of those who bring good news are a welcome sound

He further quotes the psalmist when he says:

Their voice has gone out through all the earth, and their message to the ends of the world.

We are staying faithful to the call of the Lord in Matthew 28. He is showing us His approval by the fruit that we can see. Young people who we minister to come to faith in Jesus and turn their lives around. Young people in Ireland who come from a faithful home have a place away from their family where they can finally explore their belief in God, among believers!

And then there's the vocation to marriage. Young missionaries who may or may not be from Ireland are marrying, many staying here and are a light to their peers and to this nation. The number of young men and women who were once missionaries with NET and have chosen to follow the Lord in the Priesthood or Religious life and choose to stay in Ireland, is truly astounding. Many are with Orders, some are with the Diocesan Seminary. We thank God for NET and for all the fruit that He is giving us through this mission.

Vocations


