

The **ENERGY** was flowing during Grand Chapter of Ohio



- Nov. 22, 1979, 5:10am: Grandma and I are busily preparing Thanksgiving Dinner. I am stuffing the turkey (literally) and she puts her buttered hand on my arm and says, "Oh, by the way, when the time comes I want to go to The Ohio Eastern Star Home."

At 75, Grandma was still working circles around all of us, with an energy and purposeful drive that was aweinspiring. Yet wisely, she was making her plans. She had frequented local facilities, visiting church members and friends, and undoubtedly, she knew where she wanted to be. Imagine our family's collective joy when the OESH went public! And so in October 2003, her admission came to be. There was a warmth, friendliness

and liveliness that prevailed, and Grandma knew that was the lifestyle she wanted to continue having spoken her wishes years before. Grandma resided at OESH for 8 ½ years prior to her death and our family remains grateful for the staff's care and compassion of her and of us.



Jump ahead to November 2017, my Mother entered Moreland-Hughes as a quest for rehabilitation after hip replacement surgery. Again, the Staff was important to us, sharing in our Tailgate parties and Gingerbread House festivities. Even after her dismissal, she continued her out-patient therapy at OESH.

With several friends having resided at OESH for varying periods of time, we have been acutely aware of the vitality that emanates from the staff among each other and in their loving care and respect of residents. This is an environment of which I have wanted to be a part, and as of September 2018, I am!

Professionally, I've always had two strings in my bow – work with the elderly and in development. Often this has occurred simultaneously, with employment in both fields. My development background has spanned healthcare and education, including chairing the capital campaigns for Hospice of Knox County, Central Ohio Technical College's Ariel Hall, and most recently as Development Director at Starting Point Pregnancy Center. I've also provided in home care and personal assistance for almost three decades.

As Director of Development at The Ohio Eastern Star Home, both healthcare and development aspects are dynamically merged into one — and I am thrilled!
