

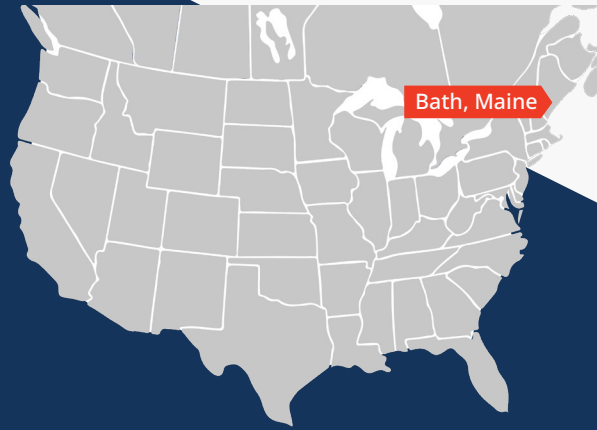
Founded in 1966, Hyde School is known as a leader in character-centered education, with an emphasis on developing students both academically and emotionally.

A Leader in Character Education

- **The Action-Reflection Cycle:** A unique approach to learning, where students take part in a four-stage sequential process of personal growth and character development.
Here students: **1.** Act (play soccer, perform a play, sing, do an intramural activity together, etc.). **2.** Reflect on the attitudes and behaviors they exhibited while acting. **3.** Visualize a new view of self. **4.** Act in accordance with this new view of self as they engage in further action-reflection.
- Using these strategies both inside and outside the classroom helps students mature into young adults that are more self-aware and able to advocate for themselves through challenging situations.

Personalized Learning to Meet Each Student’s Needs

- **Discovery Group:** Consisting of 7-10 students and 1-2 faculty members, Discovery Groups meet weekly. Faculty members provide regular communication with families about all areas of a student’s experience at school.
- **College Counseling:** Hyde’s College Counseling Office assists students in 1:1 settings. With a college acceptance rate of 100%, Hyde’s exceptional programming prepares students for the challenges they will encounter in college and beyond.
- **Academic Support:** The Learning Connections Program develops individualized strategies for students with specific learning challenges. The Hyde Learning Connections Center (LCC) is staffed by writing experts, subject tutors, executive function coaches and faculty members. ESL support is also available to international students.
- **Post-Graduate Year:** At Hyde, learning at Hyde doesn’t stop at graduation. Both domestic and international students can take advantage of the post-graduate program where they can spend an extra year preparing for college.

Engaging Residential Life Program

- **Home Away From Home:** Students at Hyde come from 27 countries and 17 states. All Hyde boarding students live on campus where the dormitories each have their own unique identities and family

-like atmospheres. The residential life environment at Hyde allows students to continue learning about themselves and their peers outside of the classroom.



A Legacy of Outdoor Education

- **Lennox Outdoor Leadership Center:** Hyde School offers students a 640-acre Outdoor Leadership Center on Flagstaff Lake, featuring breathtaking views and a close proximity to the Bigelow Mountains.
- **Outdoor Orientation:** Held at the beginning of each school year, all students travel to the Lennox Outdoor Leadership Center for a three-day outdoor adventure orientation. Students will get to know each other through hiking, canoeing and other team building activities.
