- Heritage Oak is situated in Yorba Linda, a vibrant community in Orange County. Its convenient location allows students access to the cultural heart of Los Angeles, while only 20 minutes away is Irvine, home to many museums, parks, beaches and other attractions.
- Studying in Yorba Linda also offers the benefit of excellent educational opportunities from institutions like USC, UCLA and UC Irvine. Students attending Heritage Oak can access a wealth of higher education resources, including weekend activities, enrichment classes and more.

Through The Personal Learning Plan (PLP), Heritage Oak Creates Customized Learning Experiences For All Students.

- Starting in Pre-Kindergarten, each student at Heritage Oak receives a Personal Learning Plan (PLP). These plans are written by the student's teacher using detailed data collected through standardized test scores and classroom interactions.
- PLPs customize the learning experience so that students' strengths and weaknesses are highlighted and teachers know how they learn best.
- There is also a social component to the Middle School Personal Learning Plans and each grade level focuses on a particular character trait. Students are asked to apply this specific trait to his/her own life.

Robust Curriculum And Testing Preparation Helps Students Enter The Most Selective High Schools.

- At Heritage Oak, students have the option to enroll in an accelerated math program which prepares them for high school level Algebra 2. For those with a strong foundation in math, Geometry and Algebra 1 are available as early as 7th or 8th grade.
- The science curriculum encompasses Earth Science, Life Science and Physical Science across various grade levels.
- Starting in Pre-K, students begin French language courses and are introduced to Spanish in 2nd grade. Once they reach middle school, students can select either Spanish or French as their continued language of study.



- Heritage Oak graduates have been accepted to notable high schools including Webb High School, the Hill School and Northfield Mt. Hermon School.

In Addition To Academic Excellence, Heritage Oak Private School Is Also Known For Its Dedication To Encouraging And Rewarding Positive Character Traits.

- Lectures & Workshops:** Heritage Oak invites local high school students to share their experiences. Monthly workshops are available to help 8th graders prepare for interviews, identify academic goals and develop a resume. This process gives students the opportunity to foster self-reflection and critical thinking skills.
