Dear Friends,

2020 was one of the toughest years in our history, but also one in which our mission and impact took on an extra special significance.

The Charles B. Wang Community Health Center played a leading role in the response to COVID-19 in 2020.

Notably, the Health Center stayed open every day during the pandemic, providing care, even at great cost in the early months. Very few institutions can say that.

We quickly launched telephone and video telehealth services, even before reimbursement for them was confirmed. Equally important, we have sustained these services as a permanent addition to our core services.

We creatively reconfigured space to keep staff and patients safe, and implemented rigorous infection control. We then launched COVID-19 testing and education events for our patients and the broader community.

We led the charge on vaccination as soon as it was available. As of the publication of this report, over 60,000 vaccine doses have been administered, with particular focus on those who are elderly, non-English speaking, or more likely to face barriers accessing healthcare.

And in the context of increased anti-Asian incidents, our staff provided education, safety, and mental health services to our community.

Along the way, we received recognitions at the City, State, and Federal level for the quality of clinical care and our role in fighting the pandemic.

Finally, we are also looking ahead. 2020 marked significant progress in the construction of a brand new healthcare site in Flushing, Queens. The state-of-theart Healthview site will help address unmet health needs in one of the fastest growing Asian-American hubs in New York City.

As we now celebrate our 50th anniversary, our mission still rings powerfully. We started at a time of unrest to help fight the war on poverty in underserved communities. Our founders sought to tackle disparities in healthcare, unequal access, and anti-Asian sentiment. We've made tremendous progress, but we are still fighting those same battles.

It is an honor to provide quality and affordable healthcare to thousands each year, but nothing we do would be possible without the dedication of our providers, staff, partners, and supporters. We are deeply grateful for your support.




