
-Scope and sequence



Told in alternating perspective across 5 chapters, book 2 introduces us to Sasha, a shy, home-schooled middle grader living in rural North Carolina, and Destiny, a middle grade YouTube sensation living in the Bahamas.

As with Max and Min, this relationship begins with a letter exchange program, but in addition to recipes, the two girls fast connect over cooking, sending recipes back and forth along with their letters, which contain details about their very different lives. Sasha gains a lot of inspiration from Destiny and her YouTube channel, which is focused on clean beaches and sustainable fishing. When Sasha visits the ocean for the first time to see what her friend loves so much, she finds herself wrapped up in the cause for marine conservation. Taking the stand to protect something great gives her a strength, a feeling of confidence, that she's never before experienced.



Their relationship forms via social media but soon they are more deeply connected with one another and the rest of the world when both of them find their work selected for publishing in a major, international science magazine.



He has stayed with his long-time friend Rakesh in the city for the past several years during the school year, but the worsening monsoons have forced his parents to seek a new opportunity, which takes Arin all the way to the Pacific Northwest. Now Rakesh is daunted by the prospect of returning to school without his pal, and Arin feels like he is floating in a new culture, school, and community. Soon Rakesh realizes that one can be homesick for not just a place, but a person, and it doesn't take him long to understand that helping Arin to cure his homesickness may in turn be the solution for his own.
