






Face-to-face Service Returns to Delta County

High Bill? Ask the Energy Sleuth

ave you ever opened your DMEA bill and thought, "Wow, this is way too high?" Did you know that we can help determine what is causing your high energy usage?



Rod Geiger, DMEA Energy Services, gets high bill calls every day. "When a member calls with a high bill complaint the first thing I do is look at their account on SmartHub."

Recently, Rod received a call from a member whose electric bill tripled from one month to the next. Rod, of course, pulled up her account on SmartHub. "I could see the exact day and hour that the usage had spiked in her home over a month ago. We scheduled a visit to her home to do a free walk-through audit and found that she had a leak in a hot water pipe under her home. The electric hot water heater had been running non-stop to keep up with the leaking pipe." Luckily she was able to get a plumber to fix the leak and her electric bill went back down.

SmartHub is also available to you. "Once members learn how to use SmartHub and all the valuable information on there," says Rod, "I rarely hear back from them."





Easy Apple Streusel Crisp:

Who has time these days? Try this simple recipe and whip out a great dessert in minutes. No pie crust needed!

Filling:

- 6 c. sliced and peeled apples
- 3/4 c. brown sugar (packed)

Mix together apples and ¾ c. brown sugar, and place in an 8 inch square microwavable dish.

Topping:

- 1/2 c. unsifted flour
- ¹/₃ c. brown sugar (packed)
- ⅓ c. quick cooking oats
- ¼ c. margarine
- ½ tsp cinnamon

With a pastry blender or fork, mix together until crumbly and sprinkle over the top of the apples in the dish.

Microwave on HIGH (depending on your wattage) 9-12 minutes or until the apples are tender, hot and bubbly. Let stand a few minutes before serving.

*Great topped with optional vanilla ice cream or low-fat yogurt!

Safety Alert

A kite string can detour the electricity from the power line to the ground, using the string – and the person flying the kite - as conductors.

Keep these safety tips in mind next time you pull out the kites:

- Fly kites only in open areas, away from power lines, and other obstacles.
- Use only cotton, linen or nylon string, never wire or wire-reinforced string. Wet string is also dangerous.
- · Only fly kites in dry weather. And, never fly a kite during an electrical storm.
- If a kite is caught in a tree, check to make certain there aren't any power lines near the tree before climbing it.
- And, **NEVER** attempt to retrieve a kite caught in a power line or that falls into a substation. Instead, call DMEA, toll-free 1-877-687-3632.
