

Look up and Look out: Large Equipment Safety

When working with large equipment, there are hazards that come with the job. According to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), 8.6% of the work fatalities in 2015 were electrocutions. DMEA reminds large equipment operators to **look up**, **look out**, and follow all safety procedures when working around overhead power lines.

Most large equipment requires a 10-foot clearance from overhead power lines. Cranes and derricks require an even greater distance for safe operation where overhead power lines are present. In such situations, OSHA requires that individuals, their tools, and their equipment must stay a minimum 20-foot distance away from power lines. Visit www.OSHA.gov for a full list of regulations, voltages, and distances.

When working with large equipment, conduct a site survey to identify the location of overhead power lines. Make sure you know the maximum height of your machinery's extensions and be sure to take appropriate safety measures to prevent contacting the lines. If your project requires you to work or operate equipment under our power lines and you cannot maintain safe clearances, contact DMEA in advance at 877-687-3632. We will coordinate the appropriate trained personnel to make sure your project is completed safely.

It's also important to remember to lower any of your equipment's extensions while moving. Not doing so, puts you at risk of making contact with high voltage power lines and other utilities while you are driving. This can result is costly outages and repair work, as well as injuries or death. When possible, use a spotter. To help reduce the likelihood of an accident, never store machinery directly under a power line.

If your equipment makes contact with an overhead power line, the safest option is almost always to stay in the cab. Immediately call 911 and DMEA, warn others to stay away, and wait for DMEA to arrive on the scene and de-energize the lines. Never assume a line is de-energized. The only time you should leave the cab is in the rare case that the equipment is on fire. If this is the case, jump off the equipment with your feet together and without coming into contact with the equipment and the ground at the same time. Then, still keeping your feet together, bunny hop away.

Home COOKING

Zucchini Pie

Ingredients:

- · 4 cups thinly sliced unpeeled zucchini
- 1 cup coarsely chopped onion
- ½ cup butter
- · 2 tbsp parsley flakes
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper
- ¼ tsp sweet basil
- · 1/4 tsp oregano
- 2 eggs well beaten
- 8 oz shredded mozzarella
- · 8 oz crescent rolls
- 2 tsp Dijon mustard

Directions:

Heat oven to 375 degrees, Cook zucchini and onion in butter until tender – approx. 10 minutes. Stir in parsley and remaining seasonings. In large bowl, blend eggs, cheese, and vegetable mixture. Separate dough into 8 triangles. Press into ungreased 10-inch pie plate. Spread crust with mustard. Pour vegetable mixture evenly into crust. Bake 20 to 25 min or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Let stand for a few minutes before cutting into wedges.

Watch liquids. If it seems like too much butter, spoon some off. Can double recipe and place in a 9x13 pan.
