DMEA Membership Votes Yes on Article 56



It is with great excitement that I announce the results of DMEA's recent ballot initiative. The membership voted to approve DMEA's amended and restated Articles of Incorporation, giving the co-op the power to operate under Article 56 of the Colorado Cooperative Act. In doing so, you have positioned DMEA for its next 80 years and have helped ensure we remain competitive, reliable, and cost-effective.

One of the most significant changes under Article 56 is that it allows DMEA to use a modern financial tool that other types of cooperatives across the country are already using. We can now issue capital stock as a way to raise capital for important projects.

I'd like to personally thank the membership for the trust you have placed in DMEA's Board and staff. Our revised Articles of Incorporation will allow us to operate under more modern standards and give us flexibility when pursuing member-driven projects—which will set us up for a stronger future.

DMEA will begin accepting scholarship applications this month. Current scholarship opportunities include the following:

High School Graduate Scholarship: \$2,000 scholarship to one graduating senior from Cedaredge, Hotchkiss, Olathe, and Paonia high schools; two graduates from Delta High School; four graduates from Montrose High School; and one graduate from a non-traditional high school in Montrose and Delta counties.

Continuing Education Scholarship: \$1,500 scholarship to four students currently enrolled in college.

DON'T FALL FOR PHONE SCAMS



A person calls you on the phone, claims they work for DMEA, tells you your account is past due, and threatens to immediately shut off your power if you don't pay – NOW. They often insist you give them your credit card number and bank account information over the phone or send a bank wire. In some cases, the callers even suggest an in-person meeting urging you to pay them cash. THIS IS A SCAM—DON'T FALL FOR IT.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM PHONE SCAMS

Know your account: Check your account details yourself online at www.dmea.com. Click on the "My Account" button and login to see your balance, payment history, and pay your bill.

Don't share sensitive info: DMEA may call you regarding the status of you bill, but we will never take your credit card number over the phone. We know this can be inconvenient for you, but in order to keep your sensitive information safe, we require that YOU enter your credit card number through our automated phone system. Never give out credit card numbers, banking information, social security numbers, or other sensitive information over the phone.

Be skeptical: DMEA doesn't call you after business hours, on weekends, or holidays. If you receive a call regarding your account, it's OK to question it. Take down the caller's information – DMEA representatives will give you their name, direct phone line, and email. Hang up the phone and call DMEA directly at 877-687-3632.

Take control: Some members may receive legitimate calls regarding past due balances and are subject to disconnection. But remember, payment must always be initiated by you, the member. Take control of your account and pay your bill directly: online at www.dmea. com, through DMEA's automated phone system, inperson at an established DMEA office, or mail it directly to DMEA (not to a third party).

Call the law: If you receive a scam call, report it to DMEA and local law enforcement directly. We'll do our best to spread the word about the active scam and tips to stay safe.

Educate: Scammers often target members who are considered at-risk, such as elderly citizens, non-native speakers, and disabled individuals. If you know someone in this group, check in with them and teach them how to protect themselves.

Home COOKING

Pumpkin Harvest Beef Stew

Prep time 25 minutes

Ingredients:

- 1 T canola oil
- 1 beef top round steak (1 ½ lbs) cut into 1 inch cubes
- 1½ c cubed peeled pie pumpkin or sweet potatoes
- 3 small red potatoes
- · 1 c cubed acorn squash
- · 1 medium onion, chopped
- · 2 cans reduced sodium beef broth
- 1 can diced tomatoes undrained
- · 2 bay leaves
- · 2 garlic cloves
- · 2 tsp beef bouillon granules
- · 1/2 tsp chili powder
- · 1/2 tsp ground all-spice
- ½ tsp ground cloves
- ¼ c water
- 3 T all purpose flour

Directions:

In large skillet, heat oil and brown beef. Remove with a slotted spoon to a 4 or 5 qt. slow cooker. Add the pumpkin, potatoes, squash, and onion. Stir in the broth, tomatoes, and seasonings. Cover and cook on low 6-8 hours or until meat is tender.

Remove bay leaves. In a small bowl, mix water and flour until smooth and gradually stir into stew. Cover and cook on high for 30 minutes or until liquid is thickened.
