Operation Round Up

What is Operation Round Up?

When you participate in Operation Round Up through DMEA, your monthly electric bill is automatically rounded up to the nearest dollar. However, members can choose to increase their monthly contributions to this charitable fund for any amount they wish.

The Operation Round Up Trust is made up of volunteer members from across the service territory. They meet monthly to review applications and distribute funds to individuals and charitable organizations based on need and community impact.

How does Operation Round Up benefit our community?

While the average individual monthly contribution is just under \$0.50/month, collectively your donations have consistently raised almost \$60,000 annually. Your spare change has a big impact in the lives of our friends and

neighbors in need. Operation Round Up funds have been donated to everything from medical bills to service animals to feeding the homeless.




Best. Summer. Ever.

Easy Sweet Potato Curry

Ingredients:

1/2 tbsp olive oil 1 medium white onion, diced 4 cloves garlic, minced 1 large sweet potato, peeled and cubed 2 tbsp yellow curry powder 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper 3/4 tsp sea salt Black pepper to taste 3 c coconut milk

Garnish:

Cilantro leaves Squeeze of fresh lime

Directions:

in a large pot over medium heat, sauté onion in olive oil. Cook for a few minutes and then add garlic and stir. Season with 1/4 tsp each salt and pepper and stir.

Add sweet potatoes, curry powder, and cayenne pepper. Cook for 5 minutes, stirring frequently. Add coconut milk and cover.

Bring to a simmer and reduce heat to low. Simmer for 25 minutes more. Taste and adjust seasonings as needed. Puree using an immersion or regular blender. Transfer back to the pot if needed and keep heat on low until ready to serve.

Garnish with cilantro and a fresh lime juice. Serve over rice or quinoa.
