

BE AWARE: Don't fall victim to cyber scams



HOW TO SPOT FAKE WEBSITES & APPS

In an era when we are online everyday, the ability to spot cyber threats and scams has become an essential skill. Luckily there are several key indicators that can help you identify whether a website or app is genuine or fraudulent.

- 1 Scrutinize the URL or web address. Legitimate websites usually have secure URLs that start with "https://" and might also feature a padlock symbol in the address bar. Beware of slight misspellings or variations in the domain name, as scammers often create URLs that are visually similar to well-known sites.
- **2** Genuine apps are usually available for download from the official Apple App Store or Google Play Store. Avoid downloading apps from third-party sources, as they can contain malware.
- 3 Be cautious of unsolicited emails, messages, or social media posts that provide links to websites or apps. Cybercriminals often employ phishing techniques to lure users to fake websites that aim to steal personal information or financial details. Verify the authenticity of such communications through official channels before taking any action.
- 4 Researching online reviews and checking for the website's reputation on reliable sources can provide insights into its authenticity.

SHOOT FOR SAFETY



DMEA's rights-of-way can provide attractive hunting grounds and easy passage, but they also contain our power lines, substations, and workers, day and night.

- Note the location of power lines and other electrical equipment before you begin a hunt.
- Obey all signs or postings that advise electrical safety.
- Never shoot nearby power lines or other electrical equipment. A single shot can cause vast damage to the electrical system. Damage to electrical equipment can result in power interruptions and physical risks to those nearby.
