## **Christmas Tree Recycling Opportunities**

El Dorado Disposal does not service on Christmas Day or New Years Day. Your service will not be affected this year due to holiday falling on a weekend.

Between January 2<sup>nd</sup> – January 15<sup>th</sup> you can drop off your natural Christmas tree for free recycling at the Material Recovery Facility (MRF), located at 4100 Throwita Way, Placerville. Tree must be free of tinsel, lights, ornaments & stands. Flocked trees are not recyclable, they will be charged as trash. The MRF is open daily from 8am to 5pm.

If you have curbside service between January 2<sup>nd</sup> – January 31<sup>st</sup>, natural Christmas trees will be picked up from the curb during your <u>yard waste</u> collection week. If you do not have yard waste collection in your area we will pick up the Christmas trees

on your <u>trash only</u> collection weeks. Please cut the tree into pieces and bundle the pieces with twine or rope. Bundles can not be more *than* 3 feet long and 18 inches in diameter. Place bundles on the ground next to your cart. Trees must be free of tinsel, lights, ornaments & stands. No flocked trees. Flocked trees are trash.

Residents of El Dorado Hills CSD may drop off natural Christmas trees on January 6<sup>th</sup> from 8am to 2pm at the 1021 Harvard Way, El Dorado Hills in the North parking lot for the tree chipping event. Trees must be free of tinsel, lights, ornaments & stands. Flocked trees are not acceptable.

Residents of Cameron Park CSD may drop off natural Christmas trees from December 31<sup>st</sup> – January 31<sup>st</sup> at Cameron Park Lake lower parking lot, located at 2989 Cambridge Road from 7am – dusk. Trees must be free of tinsel, lights, ornaments & stands. Flocked trees are not acceptable.
