Locations: BS14 Youth Club, and The Grove at Bedminster Down Youth Club

There may be requirement as the charity needs to work at other locations with prior notice

Expenses: Work related expenses will be reimbursed, subject to receipts being produced, along with work related mileage in line with YB agreed payment rates.

Hours: 6 – 9 hours a week, evening sessional work. Each session is 3 hours in duration

The Senior Youth leader will work within our club network to deliver engaging, educational and energising programmes to young people. They will work to deliver the best opportunities for young people, broadening their horizons and supporting them to become successful, resilient and confident members of their communities. The post holder will act as a role model for young people, encompassing the values of Young Bristol and help young people make positive choices.

They will get involved in a range of activities, from sports to arts, topic based discussions and programmes focused on specific themes.

The role will help plan programmes and lead sessions, involving youth voice to ensure young people's views and thoughts and interests are heard so the clubs work for them.

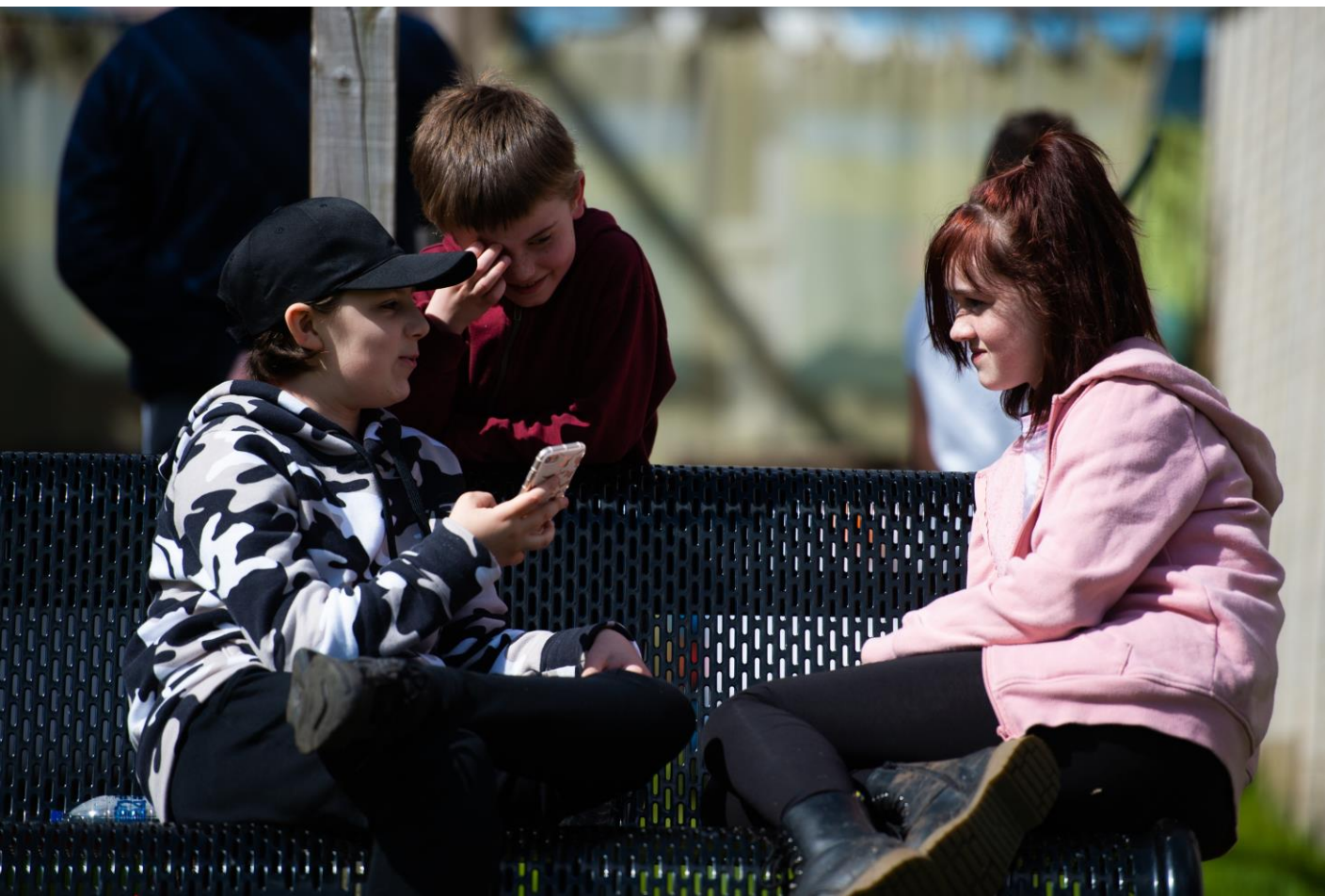
Personal Attributes

- Able to provide members with enjoyable, stimulating and challenging experiences.

- We are looking for applicants who already hold either a national qualification in Youth Work or would be willing prepared to study towards achieving an NVQ in Youth Work through part-time study. This course would be funded by Young Bristol as part of your CPD offer.

Key Responsibilities

- Acting as the Senior Youth Staff, run Club evening(s) and occasional weekends by planning and organising an appropriate and relevant Club programme that is member led.
- Ensure Membership forms are up to date, and correctly completed and nightly registers are taken recording young people attending sessions.
- To promote and encourage member participation, decision making and responsibility amongst the membership.
- To develop understanding of key needs and priorities of members and form appropriate professional relationships with members.



- To take positive steps to counter discrimination, however and wherever it occurs.
- To deliver support, advice and guidance using best practice in such areas as sexual health, drugs/alcohol, C- card, Health and Well-Being etc.
- Organise, coordinate and supervise any fundraising activities of the Club.
- To carry out such other duties as may be requested by the Club Leader or Community Club Development Lead.



Key Responsibilities Continued

- Under the direction of the Senior Youth Worker Club Leader, administer all monies raised and disbursed by the Club in accordance with the Clubs policies and procedures and to undertake any administration as is necessary for the smooth operation of the Club and/or programme.
- To attend staff meetings and training sessions as deemed necessary by the Management Committee.
- To assist the Club with working towards acquiring Quality Assurance Accreditation.
- To carry out such other duties as may be requested by the Club Leader or Community Club Development Lead.
