



Our services enable Community Groups to access good food and create long-lasting, local relationships while ensuring that no good food goes to waste. Our technology platform is also used by FoodBanks and food rescue organisations internationally, enabling them to work with more donors in their country.




OUR 2019 IMPACT AT A GLANCE: IRELAND

Since 2013, FoodCloud have established two national solutions for food redistribution in Ireland: a network of three warehouses that redistribute large quantities of surplus food across Ireland through our Hubs Solution and a retail technology platform that connects food businesses directly to local charities.

Working with over 800 Irish Community Groups, an average of 2,200 tonnes is rescued annually through FoodCloud's two solutions.

FoodCloud are also the national delivery partner for the Fund for European Aid to the Most Deprived (FEAD) programme nationwide.

OUR 2019 IMPACT AT A GLANCE: INTERNATIONAL

Globally, our technology platform can complement and enhance the operations of food banks. FoodCloud works with **Fareshare** in the UK to support the redistribution of food with their retail partners **Tesco** and **Waitrose**.

FoodCloud are also supporting **OzHarvest** in Australia, and through Tesco are working with **Banki Zywnosci** in Poland and **Ceska Federace Potravinovich** bank in the Czech Republic.

As a non-profit social enterprise, FoodCloud exists first and foremost to reduce the environmental, social and economic impact of food waste by redistributing surplus food to our network of Charity and Community Group partners.

Our 2019 impact would not be possible without the hard work and genuine commitment of our food industry and retail partners, our team, our volunteer board of directors, our generous donors, supporters, volunteers and over 7,500 community organisations who continue to support us throughout Ireland and the UK. We want to thank you sincerely for your continued support in partnering with us on what has been an incredible journey.

FoodCloud were proud to continue our three-year partnership with AIB supported by Rethink Ireland (formerly Social Innovation Fund Ireland), and are grateful to the hundreds of volunteers who donated their time to us.

We would like to call out a special thank you to the voluntary FoodCloud Board of Directors for providing leadership throughout the year and especially for their advice and guidance during the merger. FoodCloud is extremely grateful to each of the Board members for their ongoing commitment and contribution to the organisation.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE:

We now know that 2020 will be a year of unprecedented demand for food in Ireland and around the world as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. Despite the challenges the pandemic will bring, FoodCloud is determined to have a transformative impact on food waste and food security by developing innovative and practical solutions that can be activated at a small scale in communities but scaled nationally and globally.

- We will continue to focus on supporting Ireland's food industry to reduce food waste, saving valuable resources and reducing our carbon emissions.
- We will share our technology and expertise from our work in Ireland with established networks of food banks internationally, working together towards our vision of a world where no good food goes to waste.

CEO STATEMENT

2019 was a transformative year for FoodCloud. On July 1, we proudly brought together our retail and technology solution FoodCloud with our sister warehouse operation FoodCloud Hubs, to provide an end-to-end solution for surplus food redistribution across the whole supply chain under the FoodCloud brand. The power of these two organisations working towards the global achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 12.3 and 2, moves us a step closer to our vision of a world where no good food goes to waste.

2019 ATRANSFORMATIVE YEAR:

On 01 July 2019, FoodCloud Hubs and FoodCloud combined to form a single entity - FoodCloud. This was a planned outcome for both organisations following the recommendations of an externally facilitated Board Review in 2018, as they shared similar priorities, objectives, motivations and value bases. All assets, liabilities and undertakings of FoodCloud Hubs were transferred across to FoodCloud and we were delighted to formally bring together our two teams, increasing FoodCloud's full time employees from 36 to 56 working under a new organisational structure comprising seven core functions.

Under the merged entity, FoodCloud now has one board and executive team delivering on clear strategic priorities, harnessing the combined skills of the two organisations to optimise performance and impact. The merged entity supports a broader and more balanced range of income streams, healthy reserves, improved cost control creating a financially stable and sustainable

FoodCloud are now also responsible for two substantial multi-year Government agreements previously held under FoodCloud Hubs, specifically a) the EU Fund for the European Aid for the Most Deprived (FEAD), run in partnership with the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP). b) the Community Services Programme through the Department of Rural and Community Development whose aim is to create sustainable jobs for those distant from the labour market.

OUR IMPACT: **Impact Ireland**

In 2019, FoodCloud worked with Aldi, Dunnes, Lidl, Musgrave MarketPlace and Tesco to redistribute 1,192 tonnes of surplus food to 584 community groups via our technology platform. Through the last 6 months of 2019 following the merger, 547 tonnes of food was redistributed through our three warehousing hubs to a network of 235 community groups. This was made possible thanks to the generous donations of 107 food partners and further supported by the 3,400 hours provided by 573 volunteers across Dublin, Cork and Galway.

The two solutions combined had a total impact of redistributing the 1,739 tonnes of food, the equivalent of 4.14 million meals. By preventing this surplus food going to landfill, resulted in an equivalent reduction of approximately 5,565 tonnes of CO₂ emissions.

FoodCloud worked closely with the **DEASP** as the delivery partner for the FEAD programme nationwide. During the six months ended 31 December 2019, 652 tonnes of procured FEAD product was distributed to a network of over 150 eligible charities across 25 counties, supporting 150,863 individuals, 43% of whom are children.

Impact International

Internationally, our technology platform supports FareShare in the UK to coordinate donations with their retail partners Tesco and Waitrose, and also supports our international partners in Australia, Poland and Czech Republic. We are very proud that our platform facilitated the redistribution of 7,481 tonnes of surplus food or the equivalent of 17.8 million meals, and 23,939 tonnes of CO₂ equivalent avoided with these key partners in 2019.

We were honoured to formally become the Irish members of the European Food Banks Federation (FEBA) in 2019 joining their network of 24 other national organisations, including FareShare, who collectively redistributed 781,000 tonnes of food supporting more than 45,700 charities.

We continued to engage at an European level via our membership of the Commission's EU working group on Food Loss and Waste and participated in the Food Bank Leadership Institute, hosted by the Global Food Bank Network (GFN), who support food banks in 34 countries.

CEO **STATEMENT**

OUR FINANCIAL RESULTS

Our financial results for the 12 months to the end of December 2019 reflect the merger of FoodCloud Hubs and FoodCloud to create a new enlarged operational, accounting and legal entity simply called FoodCloud. FoodCloud is supported through operational income, donations and grants. Total income for 2019 amounted to €4,828,545 and comprised operational income of €1,804,692, income from grants, donations and Pobal Community Services Employment Programme income of €878,349, and FEAD Programme income €1,894,748 (Restricted funds specifically for the purchase of FEAD Product). FoodCloud's operating expenditure was €2,744,785. Direct expenditure related to the purchase of food products specifically for the FEAD programme was €1,894,748. A surplus of €189,049 was generated over the period.

FoodCloud's directors aim to ensure that reserves are sufficient to ensure that FoodCloud continues to operate on a going concern basis in order to meet its objectives, along with our vital commitments, especially to our community-based partners. The level of reserves required should also take into account the risk around potential rapid changes in major income streams and the external operating environment. Total reserves at the end of 2019 were €2,301,491 including €1,024,650 resulting from the transfer of the assets, liabilities and undertakings of FoodCloud Hubs to FoodCloud following the merger.

COVID-19 PANDEMIC

FoodCloud's services provide essential food donations to a network of 500+ community groups in Ireland and support over 7,500 through our technology platform internationally. It is essential that FoodCloud continues to provide food through our services during this time, with the ability to adapt to an ever changing situation and the needs of our communities. Our board has designated €100,000 funding to allow additional resources during this time whilst also acknowledging that this pandemic will also lead to economic uncertainty.

I want to sincerely thank each and every one of our generous donors and partners. The work we do is made possible only because of your work and commitment.

We're proud of the continued impact of our partnership with AIB supported by Rethink Ireland (formerly known as Social Innovation Fund Ireland). This multi year partnership has been transformative for FoodCloud, providing us with the additional capacity and security to develop our robust three-year strategic plan in 2018 to optimally position the organisation for sustainable future growth. We were delighted to welcome more than 700 AIB volunteers into our three Hubs in 2019 and look forward to welcoming many more into the future.

I'd also like to sincerely thank our funders for their contributions throughout the year, including Enterprise Ireland, Department of Agriculture, Food and The Marine, Cork City Council and Applegreen. In addition to the generosity of our funders, there are numerous organisations who provided pro-bono services to FoodCloud in 2019. I want to thank each and every member of the FoodCloud team: Our 56 fulltime team members, our 16 TUS and Community Employment placement team members. I would like to express my gratitude to our voluntary Board of Directors for their continued direction, guidance and advice. Thank you to the hundreds of volunteers who work tirelessly and contribute their time and expertise to FoodCloud in many ways.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2020

We know that 2020 will prove to be one of the most challenging years that communities across Ireland and the world will face due to the Covid-19 pandemic, but FoodCloud will continue to bring communities together through shared food.

In line with our current strategic plan, we are also focused on supporting Ireland's food industry to reduce food waste, saving valuable resources and reducing our carbon emissions. FoodCloud's aim is to redistribute 25% of available surplus food by 2030, an estimated 6,250 tonnes of food per annum, to support Ireland's achievement of SDG 12.3. The board accepts that FoodCloud may need to invest unrestricted reserves levels of funding to develop new innovative projects to tackle food waste, such as a project to prepare meals using rescued surplus food, as not all food can be redistributed through our two existing services.

In 2020, FoodCloud continues to focus on supporting our UK partner FareShare through the further development of our technology platform. FoodCloud also aims to expand its technology platform through pilots that were established in 2018 in Australia, Poland and the Czech Republic. FoodCloud is a member of the European Food Bank Federation and in future we aim to support this network by sharing our technology and expertise, becoming the "go to" choice for food redistribution organisations internationally by 2030, supporting the overall global achievement of UN SDG 12.3 and SDG 2.

Surplus food redistribution offers an opportunity to work to build a better, more sustainable and food secure future for us all, and I look forward to working towards that future together.





As of the merger date 01 July 2019, FoodCloud worked closely with the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP) as the delivery partner for the Fund for European Aid to the Most Deprived (FEAD) programme nationwide. FoodCloud's role is to procure, store and distribute FEAD products to eligible charities, which supports individuals to take theirfirst steps out of poverty and social exclusion.

OUR FOOD INDUSTRY PARTNERS: HUBS

We work closely with the Irish food industry to identify and rescue surplus food from food manufacturers, producers, growers and distributors. We redistribute this surplus food from our three redistribution Hubs in Ireland, located in Dublin, Galway and Cork, to Community Groups across Ireland.

Through the last 6 months of 2019 following the merger, we worked with **107** food industry partners through our Hubs solution and had the following impact:

Our partnership with AIB, supported by Rethink Ireland






In 2019 we were proud to continue our multi-year partnership with AIB and Rethink Ireland (formerly known as Social Innovation Fund Ireland) Growth Fund. FoodCloud were the first recipient of funding under the Growth Fund, which is supported by the Department of Rural and Community Development from the Dormant Accounts Fund.

Since 2018, the additional capacity and financial security provided by the partnership enabled FoodCloud to focus and develop a robust three-year strategic plan to optimally position the organisation for sustainable future growth. This partnership has been transformative for FoodCloud and in the first two years of our partnership, FoodCloud redistributed an additional 50 million meals with AIB's support.



At the start of our partnership in 2018, AIB also established an employee volunteering programme as part of AIB Together, the bank's community investment programme which was set up as a way to give back to local communities across the country by building on the positive contributions that AIB employees are making.





AIB volunteers support FoodCloud across all aspects of our organisation from operations to communications and charity engagement. Thank you to each and every staff member who volunteered their time with us in 2019.

OUR PARTNERS: VOLUNTEERS

Our volunteers are a vital part of the FoodCloud team. A huge thank you to all of our volunteers for being part of our Kindness FoodChain and donating their time to FoodCloud this year.

In 2019 we welcomed **1,056** volunteers who donated nearly **7,000** hours to our three Hubs. Volunteers play a vital role in the everyday running of our Hubs in Cork, Dublin and Galway and we could not do what we do without the commitment of their time, experience and hard work.

Gleaning

In 2019, we expanded our Gleaning program. Gleaning is an ancient act of collecting leftover crops from farmers' fields after they have been commercially harvested. With help from our brilliant partners Meade Potato Company and Ballymakenny Farm, we saved tonnes of potatoes, onions and broccoli from going to waste.









Innovation

FoodCloud works with Falling Fruit Ireland, who harvest the seasonal glut of apples, pears, plums, nuts and other fruit that would otherwise not be picked throughout the Dublin area. To ensure their delicious apples did not go to waste, we partnered with the wonderful team in The Apple Farm in Tipperary, who pressed almost 3,000 kg of apples over the last two years to make FoodCloud's Cloudy Apple Juice, our first delicious product made from food that would otherwise go to waste.





A huge thank you to the FoodCloud team, who make FoodCloud work. Each and every day, the members of our team work with our donors, volunteers, Community Groups and partners to ensure no good food goes to waste.



In 2019 we had **52** full-time members on our team spanning warehouse operations, our tech development team, partnerships, finance, communications, HR & our charity support team.

FoodCloud is governed by a Board of Directors of ten members (seven men and three women) who are responsible for providing leadership, setting strategy and ensuring control through operational and financial oversight.

FoodCloud works with the Department of Rural and Community Development to deliver the Community Services Programme (CSP) which aims to create sustainable jobs for those distant from the labour market. Following the merger on 01 July 2019, the 20 full time roles in FoodCloud Hubs transferred to FoodCloud. FoodCloud also provided 16 TUS and Community Employment (CE) placements in 2019.

We welcomed 9 interns and 39 regular volunteers to FoodCloud in 2019 in addition to up to 60 volunteers every week from our Corporate Volunteer Partners.

Guided by our values, we have a natural diversity and culture within the organisation, driven by the variety of employment and volunteering opportunities available and a shared passion to create a world that is kinder to both people and our planet.





In 2019, members of the FoodCloud teams spoke at over **40** events, speaking to a combined audience of over **10,000**.

Thank you to each member of the team who worked as an ambassador for FoodCloud and shared our story.











Globally, FoodCloud's technology platform can complement and enhance the operations of food banks. In the UK, FoodCloud work with FareShare to redistribute surplus food through their partnership with Tesco and Waitrose.

Our Work with FareShare









Since 2016, FoodCloud have been working with FareShare, the UK's largest surplus food bank network. FoodCloud's technology and support from Tesco UK enabled FareShare to establish the award winning 'FareShare Go', giving their network of charities access to direct surplus food donations in their local community.

In 2019, 2,932 stores donated to a network of over 7,276 local charities.

In 2019, **91%** of FareShare's food was redistributed through FoodCloud's technology, which is equal to **7,176** tonnes of food.

UK Impact









SUPPORTING GLOBAL COMMUNITY

Internationally

In 2019, **305** tonnes of surplus food was redistributed with International partners outside of Ireland and the UK. This is the equivalent of approximately **700,000** meals. Preventing this surplus food going to landfill resulted in an equivalent reduction of approximately **976** tonnes of CO₂ emissions.
