Celebrating Our Four- and Five-Star Donors

Earlier this month, the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation celebrated last year's Fourand Five-Star donors by hosting a Happy Hour event in Fred Johnson's Bistro. In 2022, NMCGRF had 18 donors who donated \$2,500 or more to the Foundation, and 15 donors who donated \$5,000



or more. Together, these 33 donors – the largest number of donors we've ever had at this level of giving – contributed over \$167,000 to help the Foundation fulfill its mission of supporting the residents and staff of Vinson Hall Retirement Community.

The Foundation and VHRC Work Together to Support the Alzheimer's Association

Vinson Hall Retirement
Community kicked off its annual
fundraising drive to support the
Alzheimer's Association with a
campus walk this month. About
35 residents and staff walked the
eight-tenths of a mile loop,
raising more than \$1,000 to
support the Alzheimer's
Association's effort to find a



cure for this disease. The on-campus walk marked the first of VHRC's series of fundraising events over the coming months, which will culminate in the annual Walk to End Alzheimer's in Washington, D.C. on October 14.

NMCGRF supports VHRC's fundraising efforts by contributing \$5,000 as a Courage Sponsor of the Walk to End Alzheimer's. In addition to sponsorship, the Office of Philanthropy & Engagement supports VHRC's fundraising efforts by providing communications and event assistance. In total, last year's campaign at VHRC raised an additional \$4,758.

Foundation's Legacy Walk Offers Lasting Way to Honor Loved Ones

Have you ever wondered about all the inscribed bricks right out outside the main doors to Vinson Hall? For decades after Vinson Hall opened in 1969, the area in front of the main door was a simple cement-paved entry way. Then in 1997, the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation launched a campaign to install a new brick "Legacy Walk." As stated in the campus newsletter that year, the Legacy Walk was envisioned to be "a meaningful tribute and a lasting way to honor a special friend, memorialize a loved one, or recognize an important date." Over the last 25 years, the Legacy Walk, which is still supported by the Foundation, has continued to grow.

Greeting all who enter Vinson Hall, each of the 569 personalized inscriptions has a story to tell. Some stand in tribute to heroes of the past: "In Honor of our CNO, ADM Arleigh Burke, USNA Class 1961, or "Merrill E. Debolt, Semper Fi Always, From his Proud Son," or "CDR Jo Parks, USN, WW2 Korea Vietnam." Others honor current residents: "RADM Gene Sizemore, USN 1945-1982, Naval Aviator," or "The Man, the Myth, the Legend, Gramps Clair." Some offer concrete words of advice – "Be Useful, Col. Cluff, USMC" – others pique the imagination – "Grateful Memory of Shipmates," or "Queen of Awesome was Here." Still others tug at the heart strings – "My True Love, Ruth Deal LT USNR, Forever Princess," or "In Honor of My Three Great Sons, Rick, Rob and Wayne," or "I Am Waiting Gracie, Robert Aug. '02."

Eight new bricks were recently purchased and installed, one of which was a gift to resident Althea Coetzee by her daughter RADM and NMCGRF Board member Allie Leslie. "When I heard

about the Legacy Walk, I thought, 'What a great way to commemorate my Mom!'" said Allie. "She lives at Vinson Hall, and every time she sees it, she'll think, 'This is my home. I'm a part of this.'" New Benches Provide Sport Park Seating, Courtesy of McLean Rotary Club



Thanks to a generous grant from the Rotary Club of McLean, the Foundation was able to purchase four durable outdoor Trex benches for residents to use at VHRC's Sports Park! The benches are now in place, and each bears a plaque inscribed "A Gift from the Rotary Club of McLean to Vinson Hall

Retirement Community 2022." The \$2,000 grant from the Rotary Club, which we received last year, enabled us to expand our outdoor socialization options for our residents – a process that began during the pandemic.

Over the last three years, VHRC created an outdoor recreation space where residents could gather together more safely than they could indoors. This new Sport Park, with pickle ball court, horseshoe pit and bocce ball court, has become an extremely



popular destination for residents – but it lacked adequate seating for those who came to sit, watch and visit while their friends played. Not anymore.

We are so pleased to reinforce our connection with the Rotary Club of McLean, a service organization of local business and community leaders that was founded in town in 1965, four years before Vinson Hall opened its doors. Our two entities share a commitment to patriotism and have



long supported one another. Many thanks to this wonderful community organization for supporting NMCGRF and the residents of VHRC!
