Evening with the Stars Celebrates This Year's Star Members

The stars shone brightly on November 2, when NMCGRF held its annual *Evening with the Stars* event. About 120 of the Foundation's 2023 Star Members – those who have given a membership gift this year of \$250 or more – gathered in the Ballroom for a festive evening of appetizers, drinks, fellowship and



fun. "Each year, this event is our chance to thank our Star Members, the generous donors that make the things we do for our community

possible," said Michelle Crone, Senior Director of Philanthropy & Engagement. "We are so grateful to you for the difference you make in people's lives here at Vinson Hall Retirement Community."



What kinds of things have you helped us accomplish this year? Well, through the Resident Assistance Fund, five residents were able to stay in their homes when they ran out of financial resources. The Employee Caring Fund helped staff weather financial crises when they needed help with things like medical bills and car repair; since

2020, the fund has awarded more than \$280,000 to staff for financial emergencies or above-and-beyond performance. The Innovation & Enhancement Fund has brought new additions to campus such as benches and corn bag sets to the Sports Park, a new sound system to the Alford Auditorium, and frames for resident art to be hung all over campus. And through the Wounded Warrior Fund, the community continues to honor our military heritage by offering temporary housing on campus to warriors transitioning to the next chapter in their lives.

These accomplishments are only possible thanks to all our donors and especially our Star Members – so thank you again for your continued support!



NMCGRF Celebrates Our Veterans And Builds Connections with Kids

Our residents share service-driven backgrounds in the military or federal service and, even in retirement, are eager to give back to the broader community. To commemorate Veterans Day, the Foundation was honored to arrange talks by eight VHRC residents to the 4th, 5th and 6th graders at Chesterbrook Elementary School on November 10. The students were riveted by their stories and peppered them with questions. Why did you join the military? Which weapons did you carry? What did you like best about the military, and what was the most difficult part?





Admiral Bill Morris described how he found it very rewarding to be given big responsibilities at a young age. He described following a Russian ship during the Cuban Missile Crisis, and being the officer on deck for a night watch, knowing he had to keep the 300 people sleeping on board safe. "Being responsible for doing this is heavy stuff," he said. "The Navy gave me the opportunity to do very interesting things." Colonel Mike Cluff discussed camaraderie in the Marine Corps. "I liked it because of the

challenge, physically and mentally. I stayed in the Marines because of the camaraderie. You develop relationships that last your lifetime."

General Dale Vesser took a moment to honor those in the military who did not come home. "I think the greatest tribute to those who served is found in the Gettysburg Address," he said. And then, as the students listened in respectful silence, he read: "Four score and seven years ago, our



fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in Liberty..."

We at the Foundation, thank all our veterans for their sacrifices for our country, and are honored to help share their experiences with the next generation of young people.



'Tis the Season! Foundation Coordinates Holiday Decorating Effort

The holiday season is upon us, and you only need to look around the lobbies and common areas at VHRC for proof! For the fifth year, the Foundation coordinated the annual decorating effort at VHRC, bringing about 60 residents together to spend a festive few days transforming the campus. The action began just before Thanksgiving, when Facilities team members delivered the 23 trees and their matching bins full of decorations to the halls, lounges, and lobbies of VHRC. Residents then spread out across campus to hang hundreds of glittering balls and festive garlands, fluff and affix countless ribbon streamers and bows,



and set out the garlands, berries, wreaths, and winter village scenes that turn our community into a glittering winter wonderland.

"This is a great way to get in the holiday spirit and get things going, and having residents participate was terrific," said resident Emmy Simmons, who decorated trees at the Community Building. 
