Linens, including sheets and towels, are sewn in the USA whenever possible. We change your sheets every third day unless you request otherwise. Our laundry process is energy- and water-efficient. For a unique touch, each concrete vanity was polished to expose local rock on its edging and features an artistic feature such as a dragonfly imprint. We use dispensers with high-quality shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and hand soap in our bathrooms. We've decided not to individually wrap soaps and shampoos for the environment's sake. Dishes and cutlery are made from washable materials. Coffee is served from Montana Coffee Traders' shade-grown, fair trade beans roasted locally. Recycling is limited in Montana, but we recycle what we can. Our dining tables were crafted from recycled steel by Flower Bartholomew and Hannah Plumb of Elements of Design, Whitefish, Montana. The Lodge also uses local timber for handcrafted doors, and windows sourced from the Pacific Northwest. Landscaping features native plants requiring less daily watering. Our Lodge is built with sustainability in mind: energy-efficient laundry facilities, low-flow shower heads, and concrete vanities made from recycled materials by Rob of Town Ocean Concrete. We even use washable plates and utensils for our breakfast service to reduce plastic waste. We take pride in being environmentally responsible, and it shows - TripAdvisor has recognized us as a Green Leader! We're happy to provide directions if you need them. Glacier National Park's road construction season is here, bringing with it two seasons: winter and roadwork. This may force us to reroute our guided biking trips to areas that are open to vehicle traffic or require van shuttles, which can take several hours. We'll keep you informed of your options, as they depend on the situation. From June 15th onwards, bike restrictions will be in place on the Going to the Sun Road. The first eight miles between Appar and Sprague will be closed to bikes from 11am to 4pm. Later in the season, east-bound bike traffic will also be prohibited on this road during peak hours. If you're planning a guided biking tour with us, don't forget to bring bear spray, as well as water, food, and layers for your comfort. Remember to share the road with hikers - it's essential! During the spring, pets are not allowed past road closure gates, so be sure to plan accordingly. Electric bicycles (e-bikes) are permitted if their motors are less than 750 watts and engaged only while pedaling. To avoid a vehicle reservation, you can travel into the park with us via our bike shuttle or ride your bike in. If you plan to drive yourself, you'll need a reservation for specific areas and times. We offer guided biking tours and other exciting experiences within Glacier National Park. Our guides are knowledgeable and will help ensure your safety while exploring this beautiful region.
