#### **Hospice Palliative care is...**

- Relieving pain, suffering, and other symptoms, and improving the quality of life for persons who are living with, or dying from, advanced illness, chronic illness or are bereaved.
- Providing comfort and dignity for the person living with the illness as well as the best quality of life for both this person and his or her family. A "family" is whoever the person says his or her family is. It may include relatives, partners and friends.
- Relieving psychological, social, cultural, emotional and spiritual needs of each person and family.

#### **Matthews House Hospice is...**

- On the move to 131 Wellington Street, East where we will continue to be reliant on the sharing, caring and compassion of 180 volunteers all of whom have received specialty training to provide caregiving, companionship, and compassion in our visiting hospice program.
- South Simcoe's only residential hospice, with 4 beds (soon to be 10 beds) and is acknowledged as the hub of hospice and palliative care in South Simcoe County.
- A two facility service provider-the residence at Kingsmere Crescent and the community hospice for day programs at our original site on Hwy. 89.
- Dedicated to providing skilled doctors, nurses and counsellors who are trained and knowledgeable in pain and symptom management, grief and bereavement counselling.
- Bringing meaning and quality to life for our clients, residents and their families.
- Providing its services without charge to residents, clients and their families.
- Reaching 1700 individuals a year through our residence, visiting hospice and day programs.
- Relying significantly on community support and fundraising to raise \$1,000,000 per year.

#### Treasurer's Report-

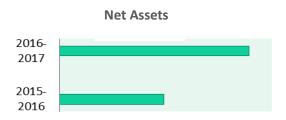

As you can see in our financial statements, fiscal 2016-17 was another very successful year as we continued our record of administrative best practices, sustainability and outstanding service to our community. This has also been a year of growth and diversity in both staff and programming to meet the expanding and increasing needs of our growing community. This period of transition has resulted in some additional expenses experienced in fiscal 2016-17 but has been essential to position Matthews House Hospice for the move into its new home and the many benefits that our expanded accommodation and programming within this new facility will deliver to our community.

- First and foremost, we can see from our statements that our capital campaign to build our new 10-bed facility is well underway with cash contributions totaling \$2,008,428 as at March 31, 2017. In addition to our cash donations received there are a number of pledged commitments bringing our total fundraising for our new building to just over \$4M. As result, our construction budget of \$6M is considered highly achievable and the Board of Directors is optimistic of exceeding this goal by the end of November, 2017. Along with cash contributions and pledges, a number of generous suppliers have indicated substantial in-kind goods and services to achieve our goal.
- MHH revenues grew 28% (23% in 2016) to \$1,306,734. Our primary events in 2016, included the Masquerade Gala, Annual Golf Tournament and Hike for Hospice. Each event generated significant net contributions to our bottom line. Donations continue to play a critical role in Matthews House Hospice operations at 34%

of total revenues and reflect a 31% increase over last year's total indicating the tremendous and growing community support for our organization.

- This was our fourth year operating the residential hospice. This year's residential costs, operating costs including wages and benefits, were \$646,482, approximately \$191,543 more than the prior year, reflecting additional staffing required to meet Ministerial funding criteria and enable training for future program delivery.
- This year saw the inception of a greatly expanded Community Hospice resulting in the hiring of additional professional staff at an additional cost. These services will continue to expand over the following year as we implement a new program called Sanctuary at Home. More information regarding this program will be outlined in fiscal 2017-18 as the rollout is completed.
- As a result of the above, and thanks to the generosity of our donors and supporters, MHH generated a surplus of \$6,582. MHH is committed to fully utilizing its resources for direct program delivery to ensure we continue to meet the needs of our growing community.
- On behalf of the Board I assure you that we will continue to operate with the fiscal forethought our generous donors have come to expect from Matthews House Hospice as we look forward to yet another successful and very exciting year. Thank you for your support!

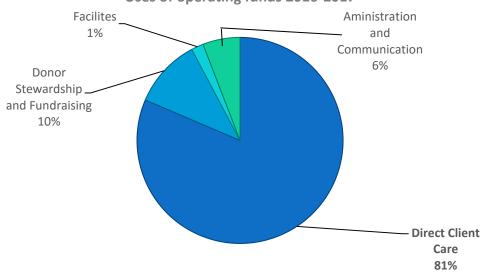

Our high standard of excellence requires ongoing investment to provide meaningful programs and services by qualified passionate staff; and recruitment and training of dedicated volunteers to support the programs.

Our community demographic is changing as more and more retiring urban dwellers are finding our community attractive. These baby boomers are aging, and the need for a hub to house the interprofessional team who provide outstanding chronic disease management, community palliative care and end-of- life care is growing.

Our government also recognizes these changes and is committed to providing financial support for the quality of community and residential hospices. But that is only 38% of our required funding.

We depend on our South Simcoe community to donate 62% of our operating funds annually to pay for wellness programs, grief and bereavement services and group programs.

In addition to our operating funds, our "Walking the Journey Together" Capital Campaign launched in November 2016. As

we all know, we live in a very generous and philanthropic community.

To date, the Walking the Journey Together campaigned has raised just under \$4 million but we still have quite a way to go and have set an aggressive goal of reaching our \$6 million goal by November of this year. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

The success of this new integrated facility will depend on engaging our entire community in this special project by everyone **Walking the Journey Together**.

The Capital Campaign Committee has been working hard to make connections, nurture and develop relationships that will last a lifetime connected to Matthews House Hospice.

#### A growing focus on Quality of Care...

In August 2016, Matthews House Hospice received a promise from the Provincial Government to provide up to \$1,000,000 toward services to be provided by a new 10-bed facility and hub for hospice palliative care services in South Simcoe and a centre of excellence. **We put the** \$420,000 received for fiscal 2016-2017 to work, paying for new nursing services. When our new facility is built-we hope to receive the remainder to provide excellent hospice palliative care.

Our CEO, Clinical Lead and counselling professionals conduct various teaching activities for students, professionals and our volunteers. They have been invited to speak at local hospitals, long term care homes, municipalities, schools, colleges and associations.

#### **Matthews House Hospice: the Residence**

Our temporary home on Kingsmere Crescent provides skilled nursing and medical services AT NO COST for end of life care 24/7/365 days a year. Our interdisciplinary health team is now comprised of trained nurses, physicians, counsellors, personal support workers, and hospice volunteers. Six new registered nurses joined us this year. Counselors and facilitators are available for individual counseling and/or one-on-one support. Family members and residents are encouraged to connect with and call upon our support staff members, who are available during the family's stay.
