The same year Mattel patented its Twist N Turn waist design which continued into 1999, all dolls made during this time period have a patent notice from that year printed on their bodies. Another way to identify the manufacturing country is by looking for the imprint on the doll's body, such as "1959 - 1972 JAPAN". The value of a 1966 Barbie doll ranges between \$500 and \$1,000 per unit. In 1988, Mattel introduced Holiday Barbies dressed in elaborate gowns for the holiday season, making them rare models that sell upwards of \$300 to \$1,000. However, more recent models only fetch around \$50 to \$100. These limited-edition Barbies appealed primarily to an older demographic, a trend that has continued until now with the highest values being those produced pre-1995. Over time, the series underwent name changes: Millennium Princess in 1999, Celebration Princess from 2000 to 2002, Winter Fantasy in 2003, and Holiday Barbie starting from 2004 up until present day.
