Mock draft 2025

Cam Ward's pro day performance strengthens his claim to be the number one overall draft pick in April. The 2025 NFL draft is just over a month away and predictions for the first round are still evolving as free agency continues to impact the league. Several major draft experts have released their latest mock drafts, with varying opinions on who will be selected first overall. According to USA TODAY, CBS Sports, NFL.com, and ESPN, Abdul Carter is the top pick in most of these projections. However, there is significant variation among the experts, with some predicting that Shedeur Sanders could be the chosen player. Meanwhile, other first-round picks have been identified by different sources. For example, Travis Hunter is projected as a top pick by CBS Sports and ESPN, while Mason Graham is considered a strong contender according to USA TODAY and NFL.com. Cleveland Browns fans are on the edge of their seats as momentum shifts from quarterback to wide receiver/cornerback sensation Travis Hunter. The Giants are playing it safe by going for the best player available, while the Patriots have their eyes on LSU offensive tackle Will Campbell - a perfect fit for Mike Vrabel's gritty team. Meanwhile, the Jaguars' top-5 pick of Michigan defensive lineman Mason Graham looks like a savvy move, echoing James Gladstone's Rams experience. Get ready to put on your GM hat and see how it all plays out in two weeks! The Raiders are looking for a game-changer to play both run and pass downs, and Ashton Jeanty seems like the perfect fit. He's a dynamic player who can bring a new level of excitement to the team, reminiscent of Marshawn Lynch's impact on Pete Carroll's teams. Meanwhile, other teams are also making moves to strengthen their rosters. The Jets are investing in young blockers to amplify Justin Fields' running abilities, while the Panthers are revamping their defense with a disruptive talent like Jalon Walker. The Saints, too, are considering a new foundation after Derek Carr's potential absence, and Ashton Jeanty could be the key to unlocking a fresh strategy. As teams look to make a statement in 2025, they're weighing up their options carefully. The Bears are still searching for that elusive pass rusher, while the Raiders are poised to take advantage of the draft pick with a talented running back like Ashton Jeanty. The 2024 NFL draft is rapidly approaching, and teams are getting ready to make their picks. Kenneth Grant, once considered a top prospect, has seen his stock fall somewhat, but he still has the potential to be a great asset for the San Francisco 49ers. Meanwhile, the Dallas Cowboys are looking to add more passing game weapons, and Tetairoa McMillan is reportedly one of their targets. He offers good downfield presence and can help keep CeeDee Lamb in the slot, which will benefit other wide receivers. The Miami Dolphins have a trend of drafting premium positions early, and landing an outside corner like Will Johnson could be the key to building a younger, more dynamic defense in 2025. The Indianapolis Colts are gearing up for a quarterback competition between Anthony Richardson and Daniel Jones, but they'll need a strong supporting cast to help them succeed. The Atlanta Falcons have a pass rush group that's worse off than it was at the end of last season, so they may look to add some dynamic pure pass rushers like Mike Green. Ohio State receiver Emeika Egbuka has had his catches broken up by Texas defensive back Jahdean Barron in the past, and Arizona's fast-paced secondary could be the perfect fit for him. If you thought Jonathan Gannon's secondary was diverse before, just imagine what it could become with Barron joining Budda Baker. Dakota State's Grey Zabel celebrates teammate Cam Miller's touchdown, highlighting the importance of supporting key players like Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase for the Bengals. With new contracts in place for both receivers, it's crucial to surround them with suitable blockers to protect their investments. This could involve drafting position-flexible OL prospects like Zabel within the top 20. The Seattle Seahawks have reinvigorated their passing offense, boasting numerous threats that can thrive in the middle of the field. However, finding a field-stretching receiver to alter team defensive strategies is vital. Matthew Golden's skills as a foil to Kupp and Smith-Njigba make him an attractive option. Injury concerns surrounding Alabama's Jhaaad Campbell may lead to a draft slide, but his long-term potential remains enticing. If he reaches the Buccaneers at Tampa, it could be challenging to pass on him given their need for a Lavonte David successor. The Broncos have been working to improve their skill players around Bo Nix, starting with Evan Engram's signing. Sean Payton wants the ability to stay balanced in play calling and attack teams relentlessly on the ground when necessary. Omarion Hampton's big-bodied, fluid running style could thrive behind the Broncos' offensive line. Pittsburgh is currently entangled in Aaron Rodgers drama. As a contingency plan, keeping an eye on Jaxson Dart's availability at the Senior Bowl could be beneficial, even if Rodgers signs with the Steelers. Ultimately, neither option offers long-term security like drafting a top quarterback prospect would. Michigan's Colston Loveland showcases the Wolverines' tight end talent, but for now, this article concludes here. Chargers tight end addition not game-changer, Loveland a better fit; Packers and Vikings make savvy moves in free agency; Tyler Conklin is a nice signing for the Chargers, but he's not the type of talent that will force them to go with a stand-out flex tight end like Loveland. The Chargers wants to blur their lines between passing and rushing personnel groupings, and few can do it better than Loveland. The Packers are taking a risk on Shemar Stewart at No. 23, but the fit is too good to pass up. Green Bay needs someone who can bolster their pass rush plan, and Stewart might be the guy. The Vikings need an explosive secondary weapon, and Nick Emanuwo fits the bill. He's a multi-tool player who can attack from depth or pressure the line of scrimmage. Houston added new faces at wide receiver, but fortifying that room is crucial for quarterback CJ Stroud to succeed. The Rams could be looking at No. 26 overall, but they might need to add a difference-maker elsewhere. The Ravens' signing of Ronnie Stanley paved the way for them to find his replacement, and they've taken Booker with their No. 27 pick to bolster their line. This move adds punch power up front, allowing Baltimore to stress defensive spacing. Meanwhile, Detroit has reason to be optimistic about Hutch's return at full strength next season, but they'll need a rush partner alongside Aidan Hutchinson after parting ways with Za'Darius Smith. Ezeiruaku could fill this role, pairing well with Hutchinson to create disruption. Washington made significant moves to address their most pressing needs through trades, and Laremy Tunsil and Deebo Samuel have already changed the game offensively. However, on defense, Dan Quinn's unit is lacking a secondary quarterback, which Starks could provide. The Oregon Ducks brought in Derrick Harmon to add depth to their defensive line. Buffalo has focused on improving their defensive front this offseason, signing Larry Ogunjobi, Joey Bosa, and Michael Hoacht in free agency. Adding a disruptive player like Banks Jr. alongside Ed Oliver long-term will further strengthen the Bills' defense. Kansas City is looking to rework their line after being outmatched by Philadelphia's defensive front in the Super Bowl. Moore may not be a big-name free agent, but getting Kelvin Banks Jr. to fortify the unit puts the Chiefs back in control of the line of scrimmage as they replace Joe Thuney and prepare for potentially parting ways with Jawaan Taylor after the season. While the Chiefs aim to prevent a repeat of this year's Super Bowl outcome next season, Mississippi Rebels defensive lineman Walter Nolen and linebacker Surtairne Perkins showcased their skills with a sack during the second half against Kentucky. The Philadelphia Eagles are preparing for an encore, with the team losing key defensive players like Josh Sweat and Milton Williams. To address this need, the Eagles may draft another speedy rusher to bolster their defense. They have expressed interest in players who can make quick penetration and line up at either end or on the interior.
