The group was founded in the 1960s and gained prominence after a violent turf war with the Popeye Moto Club in Quebec, Canada. Notable leaders included Jacques "Coco" Mercier, Giles Forget, and Claude "Johnny Halliday" Ellefsen. Chapters Motorcycle Club claims to be the largest in Germany, but there's no solid evidence to support this claim. [61] Another Grim Reapers MC was formed in Alberta, Canada in 1967, not affiliated with the US-based club of the same name, though its existence is disputed. [62] [failed verification] A separate Grim Reapers MC emerged in Louisville, Kentucky in 1965 as an independent three-piece patch outlaw motorcycle club; their members exclusively ride Harley-Davidson motorcycles. [63] [64] [65] The Gypsy Joker Motorcycle Club was founded in San Francisco in 1956 and has chapters across the globe, including in Australia, Germany, Norway, South Africa, and the US. [66] The Hardliners MC was established in Haarlem, Netherlands in 2019 by former Hells Angels president Lysander de R.; with over 22 chapters, it's reported to be one of the largest outlaw biker gangs in the Netherlands. [67] [68] [69] [70] [71] [72] [73] The Head Hunters Motorcycle Club was formed in West Auckland, New Zealand in 1967 and has a national presence; they're known for being one of the country's most notorious organized crime groups. [74] [75] [76] The Hells Angels Motorcycle Club was founded in San Bernardino, California in 1948 and boasts an estimated 4,500 members across 35 countries; its supporter clubs include Red & White, Big Red Machine, and many others. [77] The Hell's Lovers were established in Chicago in 1967 as a multiracial outlaw biker group with a presence across the US. The Hessians Motorcycle Club was formed in Costa Mesa, California in 1968 as a small but notable American outlaw motorcycle gang; they maintain at least five chapters across the nation. [78] Bkie gangs have been a significant presence worldwide since their emergence. Notable clubs include the Market Street Commandos and Hells Angels in US, Median Empire MC in Germany, and Mongols in California. The Moonshiners are known for participating in the Hollister riot of 1947. Other notable clubs include No Surrender from Netherlands, Notorious from Australia, Odin's Warriors from Brisbane, Original Red Devils from Canada, Osmanen Germania from Hessen, and Outlaws with an estimated 176 chapters across the globe. The Pagan's motorcycle gang is regarded by law enforcement as one of the largest and most criminally involved in the US. The Peckerwoods are an all-white club in the US that has been associated with the American white supremacist movement. In Canada, Popeye Moto Club was absorbed into the Hells Angels to form the first chapter in the country. The Rebels motorcycle gang from Australia originally known as Confederates, has a significant presence across the Commonwealth of Australia. The Mongols primarily based in California maintain chapters worldwide, while the Moonshiners have a strong national and international presence. Bikers' clubs pop up globally with one of the largest in Australia having multiple chapters worldwide. Rebels from Canada's 1968 Alberta chapter were part of the country's top four outlaw motorcycle clubs until '97. Red Devils Motorcycle Club, formed around 2001 in Sweden, served as a Hells Angels support club with an international presence in nearly 20 countries. Road Knights from New Zealand had dwindling membership by 2009 and their leaders faced various fates. The oldest known outlaw club in England was the Road Rats established in the '60s in London. The 1978-founded Road Runners operated across multiple countries including Poland, Germany, Switzerland, and the US. Meanwhile, Road Tramps from Ireland were formed in Limerick in 1987. Another biker war began with the Quebec Biker War between Rock Machine from Canada and the Hells Angels around '86. The Sadistic Souls Motorcycle Club was established in 2010 in Illinois, US, while also maintaining neo-Nazi ties in the region. Satan's Choice MC from Canada dates back to 1965 when it became the country's largest outlaw club during the 1970s. Another Satan's Slaves chapter originated in England around '67 and operated across multiple countries including Scotland and Germany. However, they must be distinguished from an American club with a similar name. Satudarah, founded in the Netherlands in 1990, welcomed members of all races but was outlawed there in 2018. Schwarze Schar MC from Germany was banned by their federal ministry in 2013. Sin City Deciples from the US have been one of its oldest African-American outlaw motorcycle clubs since '66 and known for charity work. The Solo Angeles club, established in Mexico's Tijuana in '59, is recognized for delivering toys to underprivileged kids around Christmas time. Several notable motorcycle clubs exist, including Sons of Satan, established in 1949 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, as a brother club for the Pagan's MC. Another is Sons of Silence, founded in 1966 in Niwot, Colorado, which was once designated by federal law enforcement as one of the "big five" motorcycle gangs in the US and has chapters in Germany. The Sundowners Motorcycle Club, formed in 1968 in San Fernando Valley, California, is also prominent. Tribesmen Motorcycle Club, founded in 1980 in Murupara, New Zealand, is a notable Māori bikie gang. Trust Motorcycle Club, established in 1984 in Ergoldsbach, Germany, has numerous chapters across Germany, Romania, Belgium, and Thailand. Vagos, formed in 1965 in San Bernardino, California, is regarded as one of the largest and most powerful one-percenter biker gangs in the US. Other clubs include Vendettas Motorcycle Club, Warlocks, Wheels of Soul, and Zulus, each with their own history and presence in various parts of the world. These motorcycle clubs often have complex relationships and conflicts with one another, as well as with law enforcement. There are numerous motorcycle clubs and gangs globally, with varying levels of notoriety. Some of these groups have been the subject of media attention due to their involvement in crime or violence. Notable examples include: - The Amigos, Pistoleros, LA Riders, Hombres, and Hermanos support clubs - The Black Devils motorcycle club, which was mentioned as being involved in a murder case - The Caloh Wagoh gang, which has been outlawed and is associated with a high-profile murder case - The Bones MC, which was reported on by Winni Scheibe - The Breed, whose information can be found on Mafianj.com Additionally, there are motorcycle clubs that have been targeted in crackdowns or investigated for their involvement in organized crime.
