Proper Nouns Proper nouns are names of specific entities, such as people, places, organizations, and brands. Examples include Amelia, Paris, United Nations, and Google. These names are capitalized to distinguish them from common nouns. Common Nouns Common nouns represent general items, like dog, city, and happiness. They're not capitalized unless they start a sentence. Concrete vs Abstract Nouns Concrete nouns refer to tangible objects we can experience with our senses, such as tables and apples. Abstract nouns, on the other hand, embody concepts or ideas that exist outside of our physical senses, including emotions like freedom and loyalty. Countable and Uncountable Nouns Countable nouns are those that can be quantified, like cat/cats and idea/ideas. Uncountable nouns, or mass nouns, cannot be easily counted, such as water and information. Parts of Speech Nouns can serve different functions in a sentence, including being subjects, objects, complements, and more. Suffixes and Irregular Plurals Adding suffixes to words creates new nouns. Some nouns have irregular plurals that don't follow the standard "s" or "es" pattern.
