Should a substitution occur during one of the boxers, wagers on the original contest will become void. Markets for fights where no draw option is provided will be nullified if the match concludes with a draw. In matches where the predetermined number of rounds is altered, all bets will stand unless the specific rounds get cancelled. Looking for a betting strategy?
