A heavily armored guard is beheaded, with the helmet falling to the ground and some blood splattering around it. The armor makes the graphic nature less visible. Some demons take on human-like appearances, making combat scenes more intense. Blood and fantasy violence occur in select episodes, ranging from mild to severe. In one instance, a character's hands grasp a demon's neck, followed by a quick cutaway showing blood splattered on the wall. A demon self-mutilates, causing significant bleeding. Mild profanity is used sparingly. As the story revolves around an elf with an extended lifespan compared to humans, themes of aging and mortality emerge, as well as discussions about the loss of loved ones.
