In Animal Crossing: New Horizons, Cousin Redd is a merchant who sells artworks but often includes fakes in his inventory. This guide explains how to identify genuine art from forgeries and provides tips on how to make informed purchases from Redd. Redd sells famous paintings and sculptures, but beware because most of the time they are reproductions that can be hard to spot even for experienced buyers. Although you can display forgeries, Blathers won't accept them in the museum, making it essential to know which ones are authentic. To make things more complicated, Redd has a tendency to sell fakes alongside real pieces, and he only offers four art items per visit, including at least one fake. Once you've made your purchase, you can't buy another piece of art from him for the rest of the day. With the 2.0 update, there are now two locations where you can buy art from Redd: on your island and Harv's Island. However, to get Redd to visit your island, you need to donate a total of 60 bugs, fish, or fossils to the museum. After that, Blathers will start accepting donations for artworks, but Redd won't arrive until Isabelle announces his presence on your island. When Redd visits, he'll offer four art pieces and two special color variant furniture items. However, you can only buy one piece of art per day, and it won't be delivered to you immediately - instead, you'll have to wait until the next day. You can buy art from Redd without actually purchasing it by using a time travel cheat on your Nintendo Switch. First, get Redd to appear on your island. If he's not available, use the Time Travel feature to move forward one day until you see him at his shop. Buy any item from Redd, regardless of whether it's genuine or fake. Then save and exit the game, closing the software completely. Next, go to System settings on your Switch, select Date and Time, and adjust the date to be just one day ahead. This will cause Redd's inventory to reset. Return to the previous day by changing the clock back to its original setting. Now you can buy art again from Redd, who will have a fresh new selection of items. You'll need to repeat this process until you've collected all the artwork you want. Be careful not to move forward or backward more than one day at a time, as doing so may cause Redd to disappear permanently. Some artworks are more easily identifiable as fakes than others. Check out the list below for some examples: * Vitruvian Man: Genuine if the circular stain from a mug is not visible; Fake if it is. * The Night Watch: Genuine if the character in black has his hat on; Fake if he doesn't. * The Blue Boy: Genuine if the boy's hair is not longer than usual; Fake if it is. Here are some famous art pieces and their actual names: The painting "A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte" is reported to be genuine. Similarly, "The Gleaners", "Rooster and Hen with Hydrangeas", "The Great Wave off Kanagawa", "Sunflowers", "The Fighting Temeraire", "Beauty Looking Back", "Summer", "Isle of the Dead", "The Fifer", "Apples and Oranges", "A Bar at the Folies-Bergere" and "Portrait of Otani Oniji III as Yakko Edobei" are also reported to be genuine. On the other hand, a fake version of "Mona Lisa" would have pronounced eyebrows. A fake version of "The Milkmaid" would show milk pouring from the jug instead of just a trickle. Additionally, a fake version of "Portrait of Otani Oniji III as Yakko Edobei" would have arched up eyebrows making Otani look scared. In some cases, even genuine art pieces were parodied by replacing certain elements to make them fake versions. For instance, in a fake version of "Las Meninas", the character in the far doorway is raising his hand up instead of holding it to the left. The authenticity of famous artworks can be questioned if certain characteristics are present. For example, the Dogu Clay Figurine has antenna on its ears, unlike the Venus de Milo, which should not have such features. Similarly, The Thinker is reported to always be genuine, but if it's holding a book under its arm, like King Kamehameha I, it could be fake. The same applies to other artworks, such as Nefertiti Bust with its tongue out or the Olmec Colossal Head smiling. A bronze box with handles in the middle instead of just on the sides is also a sign that it's not genuine, like Nike of Samothrace which should have handles only on the sides. To spot genuine artworks, one needs to be aware of these details. For instance, Academic Painting Vitruvian Man has a coffee stain on the upper-right corner, while The Night Watch by Rembrandt doesn't have a man in black wearing a hat as depicted in the fake version. It's also important to note that some artworks are always genuine, like The Blue Boy or A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte. However, others may have subtle differences, such as Rooster and Hen with Hydrangeas where the flowers should be red. To identify the difference between a real piece of art and a fake, follow our list below For now, it includes descriptions of how to tell the difference between genuine and fake pieces There have been reports of multiple fake paintings that differ from the textures used in our previous guide. To ensure authenticity, carefully inspect each painting and compare it to the original versions below before making any purchases. The Warm Painting is authentic, while the other variations feature distinct differences: - The real version features a pearl earring, whereas the fake version has a star-shaped earring. - One fake version has the subject's eyes closed, also with a star-shaped earring. - A coffee stain is present in one fake version, absent from the original. The Calm Painting and Flowery Painting are always genuine. Be cautious of variations missing specific details: - The Jolly Painting may lack a sprout on the subject's chest. - The Scary Painting features sad-looking eyebrows, whereas the real version looks more angry. - An additional fake version may have the subject smiling, but with still sad-looking eyebrows. Other notable variations to watch out for include: - Missing elements in the Scenic and Moving Paintings (e.g., hunter and dogs, trees). - Inaccurate depictions of figures or objects in various paintings. - Mistakes in detail, such as excessive milk pouring in the Quaint Painting or an incorrectly positioned arm in the Solemn Painting.
