The Curve Love Ultra High Rise 90's Straight Jean is a fitted design with added width around the buttock and thigh area. For me, this style accentuates my lower belly rather than flattening it out. I recently purchased the Ultra High Rise Ankle Straight Jean, which has a similar fit to the 90's model but features an ankle-cut silhouette. These jeans are great for warm weather, as they're designed to be worn with sandals or other casual shoes that showcase the style. In contrast, the Abercrombie High Rise Slim Straight Jean offers a more fitted look through the thigh and knee, then transitions into a straight leg style below. This design provides a slim fit without sacrificing comfort, making it ideal for those who want a modern take on skinny jeans. The High Rise Loose Jean is my latest favorite, offering a relaxed fit that's reminiscent of designer jeans. With a wide straight cut throughout the pant leg and a focus on comfort, these jeans are perfect for everyday wear with flats or boots. Lastly, I'll be reviewing the High Rise 90's Relaxed Jean, which shares similarities with the Loose model but features a more fitted waist and hip area. However, for me, this style felt baggy in the knee region and didn't live up to my expectations. Overall, these Curve Love styles offer unique twists on classic jeans designs, catering to various preferences and body types. The cropped length looks great with ankle boots or loafers. I purchased the 31 Long Medium Wash style and found that it still ran slightly cropped. A classic skinny jean can be styled with sneakers, loafers, or tucked into boots. Key features of the High Rise Skinny Jeans include a slight stretch for comfort and a fitted design throughout the leg opening. However, keep in mind that this style runs on the shorter side. To avoid shrinkage, wash your jeans in cold water without using the dryer. Abercrombie offers free returns at their stores if purchased online, but there's a \$7 processing fee for mail-in returns. Shipping typically takes about a week, with priority options available for an additional cost. The brand also frequently hosts sales on denim items, with discounts of up to 25% off once on sale. To help you find your perfect fit, I ordered multiple sizes of the High Rise Skinny Jeans and compared them in-store. While Abercrombie's sizing is generally inclusive, it can be overwhelming with so many options available. I'm excited to share with you the current styles of jeans that I own and love from Abercrombie, as well as some notes on fit, styles, and sizing. As someone who's 5'5" with a shorter torso and longer legs, I've found that certain styles work better for me than others. I recently purchased a few pairs of jeans from Abercrombie, including the Ultra High Rise (11.5") and Mid Rise (9.5"). The Mid Rise is perfect for me as it hits just above my belly button, which is where I prefer my jeans to sit. On the other hand, the Ultra High Rise is too high for me, but I know it would be great for someone with a longer torso. Abercrombie's Curve Love style has been a challenge for me in terms of sizing, as I'm right on the cusp between sizes 6 and 8. However, I've found that going up a size to have more breathing room in the waist works best for me. I prefer their classic sizing over the Curve Love fit, but I do appreciate the additional 2" through the hip and thigh that helps eliminate waist-gap. When it comes to length, I prefer the regular or slightly shorter length as it looks most flattering on my legs. However, if I were buying jeans to wear with high heels or heeled boots, I'd consider going for a longer length. It's worth noting that Abercrombie offers a range of lengths, including extra short and long, and sizes 23-37. One style that I'm particularly excited about is the new Mid Rise (9.5") version of their 90s Straight style. It hits perfectly above my belly button and has been a game-changer for me. 90s Relaxed jeans are a staple in my wardrobe, and I've recently added another pair to the mix. These relaxed-fit jeans have a high rise, which is perfect for me since I need the 10.5" High Rise style. I've paired them with silver accessories in this post and even styled them for the Taylor Swift movie in another one. I was on the hunt for some cuffed jeans, so I ordered the 90s Relaxed with a Cuff in my usual size, 28R. However, I decided to exchange it for a 28L since I prefer a bit more length in cuffed denim styles. You can check out the regular length version below. The trend right now is all about loose denim, and Abercrombie's new Loose Jeans are a great example of this. Since they come in my regular size of 28R, I decided to try them out. While they're comfortable, if I were keeping them, I'd probably exchange them for a 28L for some extra length. To compare the fit, I ordered the Loose jeans in the Curve Love style, which is one size up from my usual 29R. As you can see in the photo below, it fits more like it's designed to - with more room in the hips and legs, the length of the R is just right. If you're looking for a classic straight-leg style with a high rise, Abercrombie's Mom Jean style is worth checking out. They have a bit of stretch to make them comfortable all day long. The Tailored Sloane Pant is another best-seller from Abercrombie, available in numerous colors and fits. If you're short-waisted like me, you might find the ultra-high rise on some styles too much - but don't worry, Abercrombie has got you covered with their Harper Tailored Pant. It features a high rise and comes in regular and Curve Love fits. When it comes to sizing, I've found that Abercrombie jeans run true to size, although some styles have more stretch than others. They offer sizes up to 37, which translates to a 24W. If you need extended sizing, Madewell jeans go up to 28W - and if you're in between sizes, I'd recommend sizing up. That's it for today's post!
