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## Wegovy patient assistance program

The Novo Nordisk Patient Assistance Program (PAP) offers free medication to eligible patients with established cardiovascular disease (CVD), obesity, or overweight, who cannot afford their prescribed medications. To qualify, individuals must be US citizens or legal residents with a household income at or below 400% of the federal poverty level, and have Medicare or no insurance. To apply, visit the NeedyMeds website for current FPL guidelines and follow the online application process, which will guide you through the next steps. Alternatively, you can apply by paper by visiting the "How to Apply" section on this page. Ensure that your healthcare provider's email address is verified before starting, as they will receive a copy of your application by email and must complete certain parts. Fax or mail completed application with proof of income Eligibility Requirements: - Maine resident - Household income at or below 400% FPL - Not enrolled in Medical Assistance or MaineCare The program provides private prescription drug coverage for insulin, regardless of type or amount needed. To be eligible, one must: \* Be a Minnesota resident with a valid: + Driver's license or permit + Identification card + Tribal identification card from a Minnesota tribe (if under 18, the parent/guardian must provide proof of residency) \* Not be enrolled in Medical Assistance or MinnesotaCare \* Have a total household income at or below 400% of the federal poverty level (FPL) \* Not receive health care benefits through federally funded programs (except Medicare Part D) or prescription drug benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs \* Have an out-of-pocket cost exceeding \$75 for a 30-day insulin supply with private coverage To apply, patients must: \* Be a US citizen or legal resident \* Have a total household income at or below 400% FPL \* Be uninsured or have Medicare (private/commercial insurance is not eligible) \* Patients will be enrolled for: + 12 months if uninsured + Calendar year if on Medicare Applications can be submitted online or by paper/PDF. Once approved, patients will receive a letter via mail and may opt-in for automated phone notification. Health care providers will receive a faxed notification. Note: Medicare Part D patients no longer need to spend \$1000 out-of-pocket to qualify. Auto-refill programs terminate at the end of the patient's program enrollment period and are managed by the prescriber.
