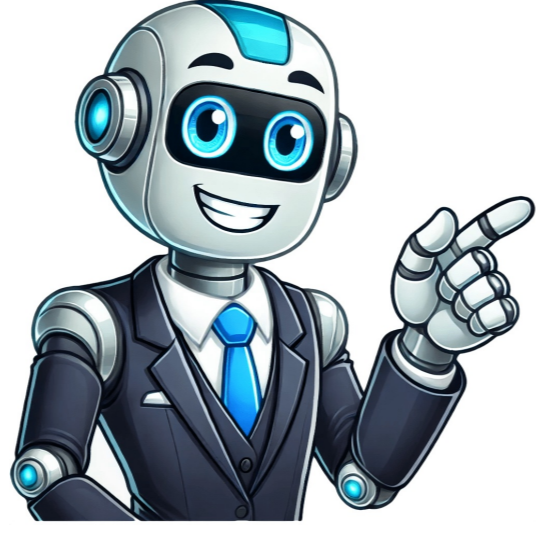

Ranked poorly in certain categories such as explosive run rate and missed tackles forced, Hunter could be a valuable pick for fantasy football teams.Jordan James, a 5-10, 210-pound running back, stood out for his decisive nature and ability to see holes and charge through them. Despite ordinary speed, he has a physical presence that allows him to maintain his legs through contact. His nose for the end zone is evident in his 26 touchdown runs over two seasons.Kyle Monangai, a 5-9, 209-pound running back, is an absolute warrior who runs with a fierce determination. He possesses terrific vision and instincts, often lowering his shoulder to barrel over tacklers. Meanwhile, Kenneth Walker II, a favorite running back of mine, put up impressive numbers when healthy, averaging 14.4 half-point PPR fantasy points per game with a career-high 7 rushing touchdowns and 46 receptions on 53 targets. Despite missing six games due to injuries, his passing workload should increase under Clint Kubiak in the upcoming season. Conversely, Marvin Harrison Jr., another top pick of mine last year, failed to meet expectations as a rookie but has bulked up over the offseason, hinting at increased involvement in the middle part of the field this time around. In Kansas City, Xavier Worthy is likely to start the year as the Chiefs' clear-cut No. 1 wide receiver due to Rashee Rice possibly facing suspension, and he ended last season on a high note with an impressive performance in the Super Bowl. Lastly, Jordan Addison, one of the most underrated young receivers, was outstanding last season and posted respectable numbers despite missing time, making him a top pick for me this year; he's also consistently been among the top scorers in receiving touchdowns over the past couple of seasons.Given article text here The NFL rookie season of Pearsall was tumultuous, with the player missing six weeks after suffering a gunshot wound just before Week 1. He took him in Round 13 of a mock draft and believes Dobbins could become a steal if he signs with the Chicago Bears or gets into a good situation. Adam mentions that it only cost him his 13th-round pick to take Dobbins.Anthony Gimino highlights Evan Stewart, a wildcard in this year's class who could jump up or fall out of the first round by the next update. Stewart was a top commitment for Texas A&M and ranked No. 1 as a wide receiver. Despite taking a step back last season, his upside is tremendous due to his track experience and natural receiving skills.Quinshon Judkins transferred to Ohio State after a remarkable two-year run in the SEC, tallying 2,725 rushing yards and 34 touchdowns at Ole Miss. Judkins will join Henderson, making them a highly electric RB duo. His physicality on all three downs, ability to force missed tackles (154), and elite pass-blocking skills make him a standout.That Carson Beck came to Ohio State was a good thing for Judkins, who has been playing a lot of reps. He got tired, which is normal when you're taking so many reps. Carson Beck beat out five-star Brock Vandagriff for the QB1 spot and did not get pressured tonight. He became the 3rd SEC QB over the last 10 years to throw for 4 touchdowns and complete 85% of his passes against the blitz.Beck is a tall quarterback who throws with precision, but also has some athleticism that allows him to extend plays. He improved throughout the season and threw for nearly 4,000 yards and 29 total touchdowns to only six interceptions. Emeka Egbuka broke out last year, finishing with 74 catches, 1,151 yards, and 12 total touchdowns as CJ Stroud's WR2 behind Marvin Harrison Jr. However, he had a rough junior season due to an ankle injury and struggled when he returned.Ollie Gordon was the best running back in the country this year, leading the nation with 1,732 rushing yards. He also caught 39 passes for 330 yards, showcasing his three-down skill set.Given text here The 211 lb workhorse from the mentioned school is looking to build upon his impressive sophomore season. Although his athleticism and ceiling may not reach that of another notable player, Nick Singleton can further establish himself as a top prospect after the next season. In 2023, he accumulated 1,061 yards and 13 total touchdowns despite taking a step back from his elite true freshman campaign. Singleton possesses all the qualities of a top-tier running back: size (6 feet, 226 lbs), speed, early breakout age, and a three-down skill set. He rewrote Penn State's freshman record book with 12 rushing touchdowns. With the hiring of Andy Kotelnicki from Kansas, expect Singleton to have a big final season at Penn State. Kotelnicki's presence should only benefit Singleton and the Penn State offense.Singleton is part of a loaded running back class, but he has a chance to stand out if he returns to his freshman form. I considered several quarterbacks for my top spot, ultimately choosing Quinn Ewers from Texas. Although inconsistent, Ewers has elite natural arm talent and can make all the throws, but his consistency needs improvement. He led the Longhorns to the College Football Playoff this season but showed flaws in his game, particularly with future first-round picks Adonai Mitchell and Xavier Worthy.Travis Hunter broke onto the national stage this season after transferring to Texas to be Ewers' WR1. Hampton should see increased carries with Greg Roman's run-heavy offense and could become a top RB1 in fantasy production.The top four picks are all highly skilled players who can be top options at their positions.McMillan is poised to work as the clear WR1 for Bryce Young, leading his team in receiving production on a weekly basis.Ward has high fantasy value despite not having impressive college numbers due to the Titans' investment in him.Judkins leads the next tier of non-first-round NFL draft picks thanks to his landing spot with the Browns.He offers high-end rushing upside and should deliver weekly starting fantasy production if he can work into a third-down role.Dart is only a first-round option in superflex formats, but his significant investment by the Giants points to potential for him to take over the offense.Loveland's Year 1 situation makes him less popular, but betting on talent, top-10 overall pick investment, and Ben Johnson's offense can make fantasy-relevant value.Henderson is more popular due to second-round capital, but still offers an encouraging profile that could push for a true workhorse role.Given article text here Cameron Harvey is a promising fantasy running back prospect, selected by the Broncos in the second round. He'll have the chance to develop under Sean Payton and potentially become a consistent option for fantasy managers in 2025. The Broncos' current backfield situation left them desperate for a reliable player last season. Harvey faces competition from Mike Evans and Chris Godwin, but if both are nearing the end of their prime, his role could improve quickly.Jaylen Warren was drafted third round and will likely share workload with other backs. Despite this, he can still establish himself as a weekly starter. Josh Golden, selected first round, has high upside but may not offer consistent fantasy value initially. His potential lies in being the Packers' top receiver or deep threat. Skattebo, picked early Day 3, has production profile that could translate to fantasy success if given opportunity.Justin Harris is an ideal fit for the Chargers offense, where he'll operate as a wide receiver and deep threat alongside Justin Herbert. The Lane Kiffin offense from Ole Miss emphasized deep throws, making Harris a prime candidate to benefit. Anthony Richardson's developing QB skills will also make Warren a valuable target. Higgins' selection in early Round 2 will make him a competitive tight end option with C.J. Stroud leading the offense.Burden and Milroe represent promising values in rookie drafts, given their talent and draft capital. If Burden becomes Ben Johnson's top wide receiver, this could be one of the best values in the draft. In fantasy superflex drafts, Milroe offers the best rushing upside among quarterbacks, averaging 10.9 rushing fantasy points per game in college. Shough might be a safer option due to Derek Carr's health concerns, but his passing numbers are below average for a highly-drafted prospect. Tuten has a strong rushing profile and potential beyond this season as Travis Etienne's backup. The Raiders' Bech is the clear top outside wide receiver, but his career numbers indicate a less-impressive profile. Meanwhile, Williams could potentially emerge as the Patriots' WR1 in dynasty leagues, with the best shot among wide receivers despite some uncertainty. Arroyo was drafted highly by the Seattle Seahawks.A potential move could make Arroyo comfortable enough to leave Noah Fant behind, freeing up room for snaps and targets, despite an unimpressive college production record; injuries played a role in that performance, leaving reasons to believe he can be a more effective NFL tight end.

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
