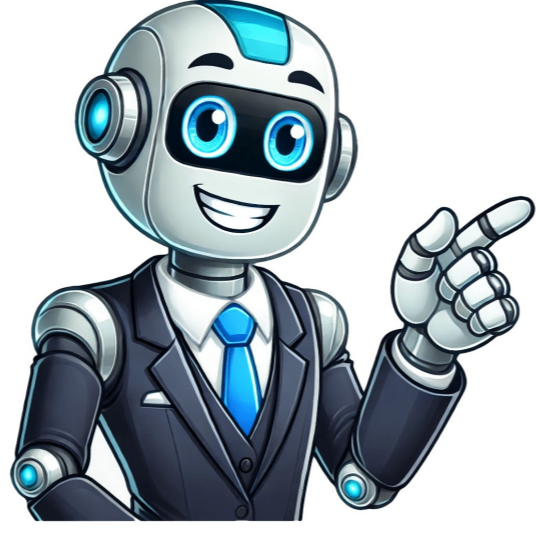

A RuPaul's Drag Race alumna, Bianca Del Rio brings a larger-than-life personality to the krewe. With a filmography featuring Hurricane Bianca and Drag Me to Dinner, she has proven herself to be a versatile performer. Bianca Del Rio will lead the parade on March 3, 2025, at 6 p.m., with 43 floats and over 1,500 members. The theme "As Above So Below" promises an unforgettable experience for attendees. Following the parade, the Krewe of Orpheus will host the annual "Orpheuscapade," a black-tie event showcasing live music, dancing, and elaborate floats. Grammy Award-winning country band Brothers Osborne will headline the evening, followed by performances from other talented musicians. It's musically themed, taking its name from the Classical mythological figure Orpheus. Founded by Harry Connick Jr., his father Harry Connick Sr., Sonny Borey, and others,[1] the Krewe of Orpheus had a record high 700 riders on their first parade in February 1994.[2] They quickly established themselves as a super krewe. The story of Orpheus showcases the power of music in both life and death. According to legend, Apollo gifted Orpheus a lyre, which he played with perfection. His music was so beautiful that wild animals ceased their hunting, mountains bent towards him, seas stopped spraying, and trees leaned in to listen when he sang. It inspired love and opened hearts everywhere he performed. Orpheus accompanied Jason and the Argonauts on their adventures. During a voyage, a storm arose, and Orpheus began playing his lyre, immediately calming the sea and ending the storm. When his fellow sailors were enchanted by the Sirens' song, Orpheus took up his lyre and sang, rendering the Sirens' power useless and turning them into rocks. His greatest feat was rescuing his beautiful wife Eurydice from the Underworld after she died from a snake bite shortly after their marriage. As Orpheus journeyed through the gates of Hell, he approached Hades and Persephone with his lyre in hand. He sang a heartfelt melody, pleading for Eurydice's return to the world of the living. The ghosts around him began to weep, and even the usually unyielding Furies were moved by Orpheus' music. Eventually, Eurydice was summoned forth, and Orpheus was permitted to take her away on one condition: he must not gaze upon her until they reached the surface. As they traversed the dark waters and passages, Orpheus resisted the urge to look back, but ultimately succumbed to his longing, resulting in Eurydice's eternal departure from his grasp. In a bittersweet twist, Zeus was so captivated by Orpheus' music that he transformed the musician's lyre into a celestial body, forever visible in the night sky. This constellation continues to inspire lovers and musicians alike. Meanwhile, in New Orleans, the Krewe of Orpheus parades on Lundi Gras, showcasing their flambeaux-lit procession along St. Charles Avenue and Canal Street. With themes ranging from Music of the Spheres (2024) to Glacial Tones and Conflagrations (2023), this super krewe has become a beloved fixture in the city's Mardi Gras celebrations. Over the years, notable riders have included Neil Patrick Harris and David Burtka (2024), Joey Fatone and Darren Criss (2023), Finn Jones, Nichole Scherzinger, and Tyrus (2022), Bryan Cranston and Charlie Day (2020), Mario Lopez (2019), Keegan-Michael Key and Jaime Alexander (2018), Will Forte (2017), Nathan Fillon (2016), Dierks Bentley (2015), Quentin Tarantino (2014), and many more. The Krewe of Orpheus is a Mardi Gras krewe that has been parading since the late 1990s. Founded by Harry Connick Jr., the krewe has had many celebrity monarchs over the years, including Gary Sinise, Cyndi Lauper, and Hélio Castroneves. The parade features elaborate floats covered in flowers, gold leaf, and gilding, with throws such as beads, masks, and stuffed animals. The Orpheus Leviathan Float is a highlight of the parade, featuring extensive fiber optic lighting and measuring 139 feet long. The krewe also has a unique float called Smokey Mary, which resembles a steam locomotive and is driven by one person.
