A good starter word should contain a balance of both to increase the chances of guessing correctly. To further improve your chances, avoid using words with repeating letters in your first guess, as this can waste potential opportunities to eliminate or confirm extra letters. Once you've entered your starting word, you'll see which letters are present or absent in the correct answer. If a box turns gray, it means the letter isn't in the secret word at all, while a yellow box indicates that the letter is in the word but not in that position.
