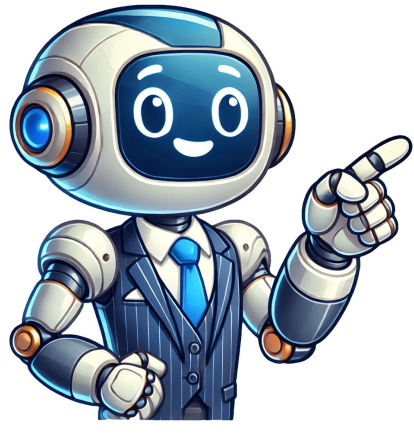

Spotify app windows 10 location

Nothing to worry! If you installed Spotify from the Windows Store, it might be hiding in the "Program Files" folder under "WindowsApps". But don't worry about it; that's just a system-protected folder. The actual download location for offline songs is stored in the AppData folder. Also, note that the icon on your Start menu is just a shortcut to Spotify, not the actual file location. Now, let's get to the fun part! To change the Spotify download location or back up your files, follow these steps: 1. Open the Start menu and search for "Spotify". 2. Click on the result to open it. 3. In the top-right corner, click on the drop-down menu and select "Settings". 4. Scroll down and click on "Show advanced settings" at the bottom of the page. 5. Under "Offline songs storage", you'll find the download location folder path. For Windows 10 users, just copy and paste this path: C:\Users\AppData\Local\Packages\SpotifyAB.SpotifyMusic_zpdnekdrzrea0\LocalState\Spotify\Storage Remember that all files in the Spotify download folder are DRM-protected and can only be decrypted by Spotify. This means they're not useful outside of the app, but you can still back them up if needed! To avoid re-downloading your library when reinstalling Windows or Spotify, simply change the Spotify downloads folder location. On a computer, downloaded songs appear on a dedicated Download page in the left sidebar. They're also stored in a Music folder — by default, your Windows or Mac Library. If you're using a computer, access your downloads by opening Spotify, clicking Library > Music > Downloads. Here, you can browse, organize, and play your offline tunes without an internet connection! On Windows, downloaded songs are stored in C:\Users\Username\AppData\Local\Spotify\Storage. For iOS devices, they're saved in the "Music" folder within iTunes or Finder.
