The film captures the essence of the man and the spirit of the times, but it may not get all the facts right. Luckily, you can find documentaries like Dont Look Back on streaming video, which offers a behind-the-scenes look at Dylan's life. The documentary follows Dylan and Joan Baez on their British tour before the famous "electric" concert at Newport in 1965. It shows Dylan jousting with the press, hanging out backstage, and looking cool. One notable moment is when he absolutely destroys "The British Dylan" during a guitar pull session. Another great documentary from that era is Festival!, which Murray Lerner covered from 1963 to 1965. This documentary captures the folk revivalism scene of the time, including younger artists like Judy Collins and Richard and Mimi Fariña. It also features performances by older blues artists like Son House, Howlin' Wolf, and Mississippi John Hurt. A Complete Unknown shows how Bob Dylan transformed from an activist folk singer to a rock 'n' roll legend. The film follows his journey through the 1960s, including his motorcycle crash in 1971 that changed him again into an ambassador for "the old, weird American." You can see this transformation in movies like Nashville Skyline and Pat Garrett and Billy the Kid.
