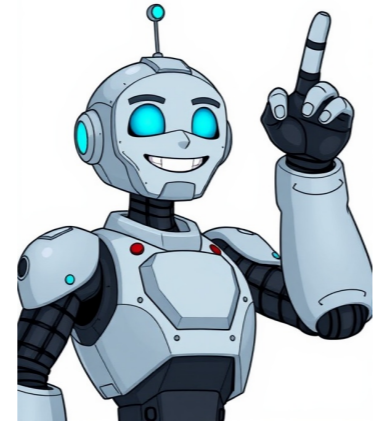

Офіційно вони не пов'язані з легітимними організаціями, але багато хто серед них має глибоку фахову підготовку та експертність у своїй області. Кожна з цих спільнот володіє власною ідентичністю і особливостями. hacker communities, from the Russian chan Dvach to the Japanese chan 2chan. These sites are a window into the world of underground hacking, where users share knowledge, skills, and experiences. ===== Unfortunately, due to their small user base, chans like Arisuchan and jakparty can make it difficult to connect with other hackers. However, Dvach stands out as a tech board that offers a diverse range of boards and a strong community of hackers. One site that is infamous for its harsh culture is 94chan. Known for its /l/ board full of top-notch hackers, the site's reputation attracts those interested in real underground hacking. The screenshot below shows the site's hackers taking down a federal informant, demonstrating their skills and dedication to the craft. Another community worth mentioning is The Party, a group of imageboards that house mostly younger hackers. With its youthful energy and popularity, they are the biggest raid boards online. However, not all raids from The Party involve technical skill; sometimes, they simply spam ugly images on target boards. In contrast, 13channel stands out for its friendly tone and focus on jokes and pranks. Its /ctf/ board hosts hacker challenges that encourage users to participate in a more lighthearted way. Despite its small user base, 13channel has quickly become a main hub for hackers. One of the oldest chans still active is 711chan, which hosted one of the biggest raids during the height of the Anonymous hacktivist movement. Although it has few users today, it remains a home to many elite hackers, including those who recently discovered a zero-day XSS attack on Tumblr. Urbit.org's Urchan community offers a unique experience for hackers, with its focus on the new technology Urbit. While not strictly a hacking board, it attracts underground hackers and provides a platform for sharing knowledge and skills. Lastly, there is Honeychan, which appears to be a trap site designed to detect spammers and bots. Its administrators go to great lengths to defend their boards against other hacker groups, often using humor to achieve this goal. On the other hand, lolcow.farm doxxes internet personalities and mocks them, sometimes leading to raids. The original imageboard that spawned chan culture is 2chan.net. With its vast array of boards on hacking, databases, and networking, it has become a hub for Japanese hackers. However, users from outside Japan may face challenges accessing the site due to posting restrictions. ===== chan culture is losing its appeal, but learning about it on imageboards is still worth exploring before it disappears from the internet. Nowadays, discussions tend to focus on anime and Linux rather than hacking. Before it's too late, enjoy the hacker underground while it's still active. Be cautious when joining these boards and only engage in ethical hacking. Participating in black hat raids is a different story altogether. Follow local laws and regulations to avoid any issues.
