Baa 5k 2025

The Boston 5K race will take place on Saturday, April 19 at 8:00 a.m., with a field size limit of 10,000 entrants. Registration for the 2025 event opened on January 29 and was first-come, first-served within the B.A.A.'s Athletes' Village. Special Olympics Massachusetts' Xtra Mile Team is still open for registration.Participants will receive an adidas Boston 5K participant shirt, along with race day amenities and a unicorn finisher medal. Entrants must be at least 10 years old on race day to participate, and the entry fee is \$60. Harvard Pilgrim Health Care is the Presenting Sponsor of the event.Special Olympics Massachusetts is the official fundraising partner of the Boston 5K, aiming to make the community more inclusive through sports. The funds raised will provide opportunities for individuals with intellectual disabilities to compete and train throughout the year and across the commonwealth.The Boston 5K is part of the B.A.A. Distance Medley, a three-race series including the Boston 5K, 10K, and Half. Participants who officially finish each event will be scored as a B.A.A. Distance Medley participant in the final standings.The Boston Athletic Association was founded in 1887, with the goal of promoting "manly sports" and physical culture among its members. The organization's opulent clubhouse opened in December 1888 on Exeter and Boylston Streets in Boston's Back Bay, offering extensive amenities to its dues-paying members. The club featured a large dining hall, library, billiard room, wine room, and two drawing rooms on the first floor, with sports facilities like a gymnasium, tennis courts, and running track on the upper floors. The basement housed bowling alleys, a barber shop, and a 60,000-gallon swimming tank.The B.A.A. organized competitive sports for young men, establishing programs in ten sports before 1900, including football, baseball, cricket, and rowing. In 1890, it hosted 27 competitions and exhibitions, featuring events like fencing, swim meets, and cross-country runs. The organization chose the unicorn as its symbol that year.In 1896, a B.A.A. team participated in the first modern Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, winning six gold medals in track and field and two first-place medals in shooting events. Inspired by the marathon event at the Olympics, the B.A.A. organized the inaugural Boston Marathon in April 1897.The organization's ice hockey team won championships in 1916, 1917, and 1923. In the late 1880s, the B.A.A. issued thirty-year bonds to finance its club building, but by the 1930s, financial difficulties had depleted its assets due to the stock market crash, Great Depression, and possible embezzlement. The organization defaulted on its bonds and filed for reorganization in bankruptcy.The B.A.A. lost nearly 1,000 members during the Great Depression, forcing it to file for bankruptcy in 1935. The association's clubhouse was sold and then purchased by Boston University, which later converted the building into a modern gymnasium. However, a city ordinance limited its capacity, so the space was instead remodeled and used for classrooms. The B.A.A. continued to be the headquarters of the Boston Marathon until 1959.After the clubhouse closed, a group of dedicated supporters came together to help the organization. They included George V. Brown, Walter A. Brown, William F. Garcelon, and Clarence A. Barnes, among others. These individuals collaborated to save the B.A.A. and eventually merged with the old association in 1936, reorganizing into a new Boston Athletic Association.During this time, the B.A.A. hosted the annual indoor games at the Boston Garden for free, thanks to George V. Burns' support. The indoor games became the premier event for the organization, attracting top athletes such as Cornelius Warmerdam and Ron Delany. However, attendance declined over the years, making the event unprofitable. In 1971, the decision was made to end the B.A.A. meet.The Boston Athletic Association also faced controversy during the Korean War, with president George V. Brown denying entry to three Korean runners in 1951. The association reversed this ban the following year. Brown was succeeded by Will Cloney, who served as president from 1964 to 1982. Historically male-dominated, the B.A.A. did not allow women to register for the Boston Marathon until 1972.Kathrine Switzer was the first woman to run the Boston Marathon. She completed it without registering and finished faster than two-thirds of the men's competitors. In 1967, another woman named Gibb ran the marathon without registering too.In 1972, women were allowed to register for the race after the Amateur Athletic Union approved them. The number of female participants increased, with Nina Kuscsik finishing first in the inaugural women's field. Since then, women have become more involved in running with organizations such as the B.A.A.The Boston Athletic Association's history spans over 125 years, from its founding in 1887 to 2012. The BAA was instrumental in organizing the first Olympic team and hosting the iconic Boston Marathon, which has been running annually for 121 years.Throughout its history, the organization has undergone significant changes, including reorganizations, closures, and shifts in leadership. Notable figures such as John Hanc, Craig Lambert, and Leanna Scachetti have contributed to the BAA's history, highlighting its impact on sports and the community.The BAA also played a role in women's participation in running, with pioneers like Kathrine Switzer breaking barriers and paving the way for future generations. The organization's efforts to promote inclusivity and diversity have had a lasting impact on the sport.Additionally, the BAA was involved in various other sports, including hockey, and faced challenges such as financial struggles and controversies.
