They should also attach any other important documents like blueprints or lists of materials that will be used in the projects. When working on construction projects, homeowners and contractors have to follow federal and local laws, such as those related to fair labor practices and accessibility standards. To make sure everything is done correctly, it's a good idea for both parties to research these laws.
