I 38 turni del campionato di calcio di Serie A saranno disputati dal 17 agosto, con l'Inter che cerca di difendere il titolo conquistato nella stagione precedente.Il prossimo big match del torneo sar tra la Juventus e la Roma a Torino al terzo turno. Il primo derby della Madonnina stagionale si terr solo alla quinta giornata, mentre l'ottavo turno vedr due incontri ad alta tensione tra la Juventus e il Lazio, e tra la Roma e il Milan.il 25esimo turno sar un big match importante, ma il derby di ritorno tra i due tornei si terr al 15esimo turno, quando Thiago Motta affronter il Bologna. Known for its tactical discipline and defensive rigor, the Serie A has consistently ranked among the strongest leagues globally. As of 202425, it ranks second in the UEFA coefficient rankings based on performances in European competitions over the past five seasons.The Serie A is home to several successful clubs, including Juventus, Inter Milan, and AC Milan. These teams have played a key role in European football governance and competition history. Juventus has achieved international success across all major UEFA and intercontinental tournaments, while Milan and Inter have earned significant honors. Alongside Roma, Napoli, Lazio, and Fiorentina, these clubs form the "seven sisters" (sette sorelle) of Italian football.The Serie A has historically attracted top global talent, producing numerous Ballon d'Or winners and World Cup champions. The Federazione Italiana del Football (FIF) began organising football in Italy in 1898. Its first competition, the 1898 Italian Football Championship, was held at the Velodrome Humbert I in Turin on May 8, 1898. Genoa CFC won the championship on five out of six occasions, interrupted by AC Milan in 1901. The FIF later joined FIFA and was renamed to Federazione Italiana Giuoco Calcio (FIGC).The Italian football league has undergone several reorganisations over the years. In the past, it was divided into non-regional groups, with winners playing off in a final to determine the national champion. In 1926, the Fascist regime took control of the FIGC, and the Prima Divisione was replaced by Divisione Nazionale. This division initially consisted of 12 teams from the previous Lega Nord, plus two Roman teams that merged into AS Roma and SSC Napoli. The top three teams in each group then played in a round robin finals competition to decide the national champion.In 1929, Italian football reorganised to form a national two-division hierarchy with end-of-season promotion and relegation between the two divisions, branded Serie A and Serie B. Internazionale won the inaugural Serie A title during their time as Ambrosiana. After World War II, the North-South divisions of Divisione Nazionale were restored for one season before Serie A was re-established in 1946.The Italian league championship title is often referred to as the scudetto, with winners receiving a small coat of arms with the Italian tricolour on their strip from the 1923-24 season. An actual trophy, the Coppa Campioni d'Italia, has been awarded to the winning club since the 1960-61 season.In April 2009, Serie A announced its split from Serie B due to disagreements over television rights. In 2016, Serie A was selected by the International Football Association Board to test video replays, which were initially private for the 2016-17 season and became a live pilot phase in the 2017-18 season.In February 2024, sixteen clubs voted against reducing the division to 18 teams, ensuring that Serie A will continue with its current 20-team format. For most of its history, Serie A has had 16 or 18 clubs competing at the top level, but since 2004-05, there have been 20 clubs in total, except for one season (1947-48) played with 21 teams.League's history began with 18 clubs from 1929-1934, decreasing to 16 teams for a period from 1934-1943. After World War II, the league expanded again, reaching highs of 21 and 20 teams in subsequent years before settling at 18 clubs from 1952-1967. From 1967 onwards, the number of participating teams fluctuated between 16 and 20, with a notable shift to 20 clubs starting from 2004.The Italian football league adopts a unique round-robin format, where each team plays every other team twice - once at home and once away, resulting in a total of 38 games per season. The league is divided into two halves: the first half (andata) features each team playing 19 games against their opponents, while the second half (ritorno) reverses home and away matches for another 19 games.Prior to the 1994-95 season, teams earned two points for a win and one point for a draw. However, since then, they have been awarded three points for a win, one point for a draw, and no points for a loss. The bottom three teams are relegated to Serie B, with three Serie B teams promoted to replace them.In recent years, Italian clubs have performed exceptionally well in European competitions, contributing to Serie A's top ranking by UEFA coefficient. As a result, the top five teams qualify directly for the Champions League starting from 2024. In case of ties, tiebreakers such as head-to-head points, goal difference, and higher number of goals scored are applied to determine the outcome.The Scudetto is awarded to the top team in Italy's Serie A league at the end of each season. In the past, if two or more teams were tied for first place, a playoff would be held to determine the champion. This has only happened once, in 1963-64, when Bologna defeated Inter 2-0 in a playoff match.Prior to 2005-06, playoffs were used not only to decide the Scudetto winner but also to determine qualification for European competitions and relegation. Gianluigi Buffon holds the record for most appearances in Serie A with 657 games played. Other notable players include Paolo Maldini, Francesco Totti, Javier Zanetti, and Samir Handanovi, who all have over 500 appearances each.In terms of goal-scoring records, Silvio Piola is the highest scorer in Serie A history with 274 goals. Other top scorers include Francesco Totti, Gunnar Nordahl, Giuseppe Meazza, Antonio Di Natale, and Roberto Baggio, who all have over 150 goals each.In terms of nationality, Serie A has a diverse range of players from EU and non-EU countries. In the 2016-17 season, Sassuolo faced sanctions for fielding an ineligible player.The IFFHS (International Federation of Football History and Statistics) has recognized Inter Milan as one of the top teams of all time, with five titles in a single season between 2010 and 2011. DAZN acquired exclusive Serie A rights for Spain until 2027 and also secured Ligue 1 and Serie A rights in Switzerland.Italian football has faced challenges related to non-EU player imports. UEFA implemented rules to restrict non-EU players in 2002, following a scandal involving fake passports in Serie A. The Italian Football Federation (FIGC) introduced regulations to address the issue, including the use of "tesseramento extracomunitari" for non-EU players.The FIGC has issued various communications and circulars regarding non-EU player imports, club Italia, and sector incentives.
