Percy jackson and the labyrinth

They discover a tunnel that leads to Kronos' palace, where Percy encounters Luke instead of Kronos. After a tense confrontation, Percy escapes with Nico's help. The group later finds Tyson and Grover injured in Carlsbad Caverns under New Mexico. Pan appears, declaring himself dead due to his domain being too damaged. However, before dissolving, he imbues each member with a piece of himself. The group emerges from the Labyrinth, with Percy reassuring Rachel that her father's wealth wasn't responsible for their rescue. They return to camp just in time to see it preparing for war, and Percy reunites with Chiron before Kronos' army erupts from the Labyrinth. Towards the end of summer, Annabeth finally reveals the rest of her propcey about delvin into the darkness of the endless maze and facin various challenges. Hera suddenly shows up and gets offended when they remark that she only cares about perfect families. She reminds them that she'll remember this insult and disappears. Percy goes back home to celebrate his 15th birthday with his mom, Paul, and Tyson. Poseidon shows up for Percy's birthday and tells him that he's his favorite son. Before leavin, Poseidon gives Percy a sand dollar as a gift. Nico suddenly appears claimin that he's found a way to beat Kronos. Percy Jackson's quest takes him through the Labyrinth, guided by Daedalus' inventions and a silver laptop.
