With a history dating back to 1907, it's known for its electric atmosphere, particularly before kick-off when "Jerusalem" and "God Save the Queen" are sung. Stade de France (France) - Capacity: 80,698 Located in Saint-Denis, this stadium hosts French rugby's biggest games. It's famous for its pre-match rendition of "La Marseillaise", which creates an unforgettable atmosphere. However, it can turn sour when the team underperforms. Aviva Stadium (Ireland) - Capacity: 51,700 In Dublin's city centre, the Aviva Stadium has a modern design with incredible acoustics that amplify "Ireland's Call". It's a rowdy but welcoming venue that reflects Irish passion for rugby. As Ireland's national team continues to grow stronger in the 21st century, some matches stand out as classics. One such instance is the thrilling 20-23 defeat against Scotland in 2010 at Stadio Olimpico (Italy). This iconic venue, located near the River Tiber in Rome, offers a unique atmosphere with passionate fans chanting "Fratelli d'Italia". A memorable Six Nations moment came in 2011 when Italy stunned France 22-21. To get to the stadium from Termini Station, take the Metre (A line) towards Battistini and alight at Ottaviano before catching tram (No. 2 line) to Piazza Mancini. In contrast, BT Murrayfield Stadium (Scotland) has a distinctively emotional atmosphere due to its bagpipes and "Flower of Scotland". This Edinburgh venue witnessed a stunning 38-38 comeback against England in the 2019 Calcutta Cup. Located in the west of Edinburgh, it's within walking distance from Princes Street and Waverley Station, with buses and trams also providing easy access. The Principality Stadium (Wales) in Cardiff is famous for its closed roof, creating a roaring cauldron of sound when fans sing "Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau" (Land of My Fathers). Historical highlights include Wales' 2013 thrashing of England for the Six Nations title. The stadium is just a five-minute walk from Cardiff Central Station and offers a pure intensity that makes it a Welsh rugby cathedral, during good times and bad. Unlike football, there are no away sections in Six Nations Championship stadiums; fans from both nations mingle and cheer their teams on in good humour. This allows for easy ticket purchases as you don't need to worry about booking seats. When buying tickets to watch England at the 2025 Six Nations, you can expect them to put in a good show but not dominate the tournament. They tend to pick up wins every few seasons and are third-favourites going into the championships. England has had success in the past, holding an impressive record with 29 titles and securing 13 Grand Slams and 26 Triple Crowns. Their rivalry with Scotland is a fan favourite, and watching them play at Twickenham can be an intense experience. France is second-favourites to win the tournament and looks like a strong contender. They have a talented squad, including star man Antoine Dupont, who is considered the best player in the world right now. France has won the Championship 18 times outright and has a record of 10 Grand Slams. Ireland is the team to beat going into the 2025 Six Nations. They are loaded with talent, including number eight Caelan
