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Wwe draft 2025

WWE.com reports that the promotion has not yet finalized the roster changes after the inaugural "Transfer Window". According to Mike Johnson, WWE is set to hold its annual draft, planned for the post-WrestleMania season. The draft was supposed to include wrestlers like Logan Paul and AJ Styles, but some have since changed their mind. The Wyatt Family was transferred to SmackDown, while Braun Strowman also joined the brand. However, WWE has reneged on its initial plan, with Austin Theory and Grayson Waller spending more time in NXT. Bayley's move to Raw was short-lived, as she returned to SmackDown for a match. The Transfer Window was a confusing experiment that raised suspicions about WWE's creative direction. The recent Elimination Chamber event restored faith in the company's plans. Fans are eagerly awaiting this year's draft, which is expected to take place after Backlash 2025. However, there is no official confirmation on its date. Given article text here Roman Reigns is expected to move to Monday Night RAW if the Draft 2025 takes place, according to sources. This decision would allow WWE to book a full-fledged feud between Rollins and Reigns, potentially boosting ratings on the Netflix show. Roman's exclusive presence on RAW would also provide an opportunity for the Stamford-based promotion to focus on its own storylines. Furthermore, it is believed that Gunther will move to SmackDown if the Draft occurs, as his reign as World Heavyweight Champion was highly successful and has now ended. This change would give Gunther a fresh start in the blue brand. In contrast, Penta and Becky Lynch are expected to stay on RAW. Penta's popularity and unique style have made him an instant breakout star, while Lynch is a future Hall of Famer who remains competitive at a high level. On the other hand, Damian Priest and Logan Paul are expected to join SmackDown. Priest is a quality pick with his ability to headline shows and work with various talent, while Paul's social media presence makes him valuable for WWE's mainstream expansion efforts. The WWE transfer window ran from January. Big names like Drew McIntyre, Damian Priest, and Bayley moved between brands ahead of WrestleMania season, with SmackDown picking up some key talent after its schedule change to three hours a week. According to PWInsider, the WWE Draft is still set for this year's WrestleMania season, which will likely include NXT in addition to Raw and SmackDown. Meanwhile, Duke Lesnar, son of former WWE and UFC champ Brock Lesnar, has joined the Medicine Hat Tigers in the Western Hockey League. The team picked him up in the fifth round of their prospects draft last Thursday. Lesnar scored 28 points (15 goals, 13 assists) in 30 games for the Notre Dame Hounds U15 prep team before joining the Tigers. His older brothers Turk and Luke also play hockey. Other title matches include Dominik Mysterio and Jacob Fatu defending their championships and Lyra Valkyria facing Becky Lynch for the Women's Intercontinental Championship. This match an mini-feud (hopefully) is absurd an I hate it. Less McAfee in general, the beter, as far as I'm concerned. Put him in a program with one of the best wrestlers in the company? It's honestly blasphemous.Sure, guy can bump his ass off, but that's all it should be: A chop-filled bump-fest of Gunther beating McAfee down for five minutes. Think — an hope — that's exactly what it will be.WWE will give McAfee a brief little moment of hope before probably getting choked out again.Sulla-Heffinger: Full disclosure, on Monday afternoon I was very ready to dump on this feud as being silly an useless. Then, McAfee cut his promo on "WWE Raw" and completely changed my mind on it.I don't think this will go 20 minutes or be on anyone's list for Match of the Year, but it'll do an incredible job of soft-resetting Gunther for the rest of 2025. Although he was working heel heading into WrestleMania 41 an destroying every Uso in his path in the process, "The Ring General" didn't necessarily evoke the level of fear one would expect because it was fairly obvious he was losing to Jey Uso in Las Vegas.The beauty of McAfee's promo is that he basically called out all of that on Monday night, saying Gunther's passion an hunger were gone, that he had become complacent — lost his mean streak, if you will. That didn't sit well with Gunther an should bring out the fearsome, ferocious, unrelenting version of the Austrian star we have become accustomed to.McAfee will get his rallying moments, but they'll be short an he's going to get brutalized at Backlash.As far as WWE leaning too heavily into crossover stars, I think we're all still feeling a little bit burned by Travis Scott's involvement in WrestleMania 41's main event. Whatever your opinion was on that, there's a clear difference to me between Scott an someone who competes in the ring on a semi-regular basis like Logan Paul or McAfee.Jackman: Surely we're looking at an uncomplicated win for "The Ring General" here, albeit with a few lucky breaks for the underdog along the way? It's true that McAfee surprised everyone with how well he could work back at WrestleMania 38, but that was a very different prospect to this match — which involves squaring off against one of the most intimidating men in professional wrestling.I should also mention that terrible angle from the 2022 Rumble, when we had McAfee voluntarily eliminating himself rather than get into the ring with Omos an Bron Breakker. I know comedy spots are an inherent part of the Rumble, but it felt like a disservice to McAfee given what he'd pulled off at WrestleMania an it continues to undermine him (at least in my eyes) going into Saturday.As for the crossover stars, I try to take them on a case-by-case basis. McAfee is a genuine fan who has done his bit for Looking at how Gunther has performed in previous matches, he's shown his ability to withstand a good amount of punishment. This is quite different from someone like Travis Scott, who only got the role after being promoted on social media and later became involved in a high-profile match at WrestleMania. Dansby: Although this is just an initial match between Gunther and McAfee, there's still potential for it to steal the show due to Gunther's exceptional ring skills. He'll likely dominate the bout for most of it before "The Ring General" secures a decisive victory. Sulla-Heffinger: Given the ongoing tension between Fatu and Sikoa, it seems logical that Sikoa could sabotage Fatu in a Fatal Four-Way match. However, I don't think this is the best approach just yet. Instead, we should let things simmer and have Sikoa potentially cost Fatu the briefcase at Backlash before the payoff comes later. Jackman: WWE often uses multi-man matches to switch the belt without undermining the previous champion. This might be what's happening here, especially with Damian Priest winning and then realizing he's now a target for Fatu. Additionally, having Breakker lose his belt also means there isn't another "big guy" holding one of the titles right now. Dansby: For Jacob Fatu to benefit from the U.S. title, he should continue to hold it in the near future. The tension between him and Sikoa is increasing each week, making this a crucial factor for their ongoing storyline. Riggs: I think Fatu losing the title would be best for his character development. This match format can be used as an excuse for him to lose, which is perfect for now that Sikoa's story has reached its peak. Jackman: The stable has had notable segments on "WWE Raw," but they still need a clear path for a potential match. It's better to avoid giving them an obvious matchup and let things unfold naturally. Monday nights, we might not get the biggest and juiciest matchups, but that can change come SummerSlam in August. The Paul Levesque era is all about quality over quantity when it comes to matches on a card, so it's okay if new big bads on "Raw" take a break. This week's episode received a perfect 10/10 Crown Score, indicating something is working well. We should look at PLEs like UFC cards - not every championship is defended on every pay-per-view. This keeps things fresh and exciting. It would be forced to have this trio fit in right now, but maybe we'll see them show up on Friday night with a trios match against Jey Uso, Sami Zayn, and CM Punk brewing. That could lead to a trios match or 3 vs. 2 handicap match. If the former route is taken, Logan Paul would be a perfect mystery partner, but that would be pretty insane. It's best for Rollins, Breakker, and Heyman to focus on targeting Jey Uso and his championship. The WWE Draft 2025 is expected to shake things up later this year.
