TikTok's algorithm promoted a deepfake porn video of Billie Eilish on users' For You Pages, which racked up 11 million views before being removed for violating the platform's guidelines on sexual harassment. A fake, sexually charged image of the singer was created using an AI system and pushed to users for four days before being deleted. This incident highlights concerns about deepfake technology, as apps like Midjourney and Lensa have already faced criticism for their tendency to sexualize women in AI-generated images. Actress Megan Fox recently expressed her horror at the explicit photos generated by Lensa of herself. The TikTok account responsible for posting the deepfake content had a significant following and offered to create more explicit material for a fee. Experts warn that such incidents demonstrate the need for social media platforms to better distinguish between engaging content and potentially harmful or harassment-inducing material. Billie Eilish's Debut Album 'When We All Fall Asleep' Marks a New Chapter in Her Music Career Billie Eilish is set to release her debut album, 'When We All Fall Asleep', on March 17th, exclusively on Prime Video.
