For Mac users who want to enjoy Netflix content offline, there's a way despite the lack of a native app for macOS. Although the platform doesn't offer direct downloads on Macs, several workarounds are available. One method is using an iPhone or iPad with Apple's Sidecar feature, which allows you to mirror your device's screen onto your Mac and watch downloaded content on a larger screen. Alternatively, you can use AirPlay to stream content from your iOS device to your Mac. If you prefer downloading Netflix directly to your Mac, running Windows via Boot Camp is an option. A dedicated app for Netflix on Apple devices would be a significant improvement, and hopefully, this imbalance will be addressed soon. For those with newer Apple silicon laptops like the M2 MacBook Air or 14-inch MacBook Pro, there's a workaround. First, download Parallels Desktop and install it. Follow the link to get started with the Windows 11 installation process. Once installed, head over to the Microsoft Store and download Netflix. While it offers more capabilities than just Netflix offline viewing, some may find it too expensive. For those with older Intel-based Macs, there's a free alternative in Boot Camp. Using PlayCover to Watch Netflix Offline on a Mac Using Parallels to Install Windows for Netflix App on Macs Is Time-Consuming and Inconvenient If you want to install the Windows Netflix app on a Mac, using the M2 or M3 chip with a Parallels virtual machine is an option. However, this method only allows watching Netflix content in Windows, not offline on Macs. Downloading and watching Netflix offline through Parallels results in "error code U7354" due to technical limitations. Setting up Parallels takes time and requires purchasing the software for \$99.99 per year. Although other virtual machines like VMware Fusion are available, Parallels is the easiest way to set up Windows on a Mac. Alternatively, you can record Netflix content on your Mac using a screen recorder. However, this method has several drawbacks: - It's against Netflix's terms and conditions, which may result in account suspension. - It's inconvenient as you need to play the entire show or movie while recording it, leaving no time for other activities. - The audio and video quality depend on your internet connection, resulting in poor quality if the connection is weak or disrupted. - Recorded files are large and take up valuable space on your Mac hard drive. Note that Netflix will not appear in your Mac's Applications folder but rather within the PlayCover App Library. Users can then access the app, enter their credentials, and download content for offline viewing. Installing Windows Netflix App on Mac: Intel vs Apple Silicon If you have an Intel-based Mac, installing Windows with Boot Camp is recommended for accessing Netflix offline. However, this method won't work on Apple Silicon Macs. For M1/M2/M3 chip-based Macs, using Parallels to install Windows in a virtual machine can be used, but it doesn't allow streaming content offline on Macs. Alternatively, you can record Netflix shows and movies on your Mac for free using QuickTime Player or other screen recording software, but this method has its drawbacks. To capture internal audio from Netflix, users need to install an additional plugin for QuickTime. This setup allows them to screen record their entire Mac screen or select specific applications like Netflix. With the plugin installed, they can start recording by clicking anywhere on the screen. If a user has an iPad, iPhone, or iPod Touch, they can connect it to their Mac via cable and watch shows using the Netflix app. For offline viewing on a Mac with an iOS device connected, users must ensure their iOS device is running iOS 13 or higher. For Netflix, installing Windows on a Mac is an option, either by using Boot Camp on Intel Macs or Parallels on Apple Silicon Macs, although the latter method has limitations with offline content and requires purchasing software. A more straightforward approach would be to use a screen recorder like QuickTime Player to record Netflix shows, but this comes with its own set of drawbacks, including potential account suspension, poor video quality, and large file sizes that can quickly consume storage space on the Mac. To screen record Netflix shows on your Mac, you can use QuickTime Player, which is available for free.
