can you help me find a hotel in Jakarta that is close to both the action area and nightlife party scene? i'm looking for a non-smoking room with no lingering smells of smoke. my budget is around \$50 usd per night. ideally, the hotel should be reasonably located between these two areas. some hotels i've looked at include luminor, movenpick, holiday inn gajah mada, mercure, harris vertu, millenium hotel, and grand g7 pasar baru. however, most of them seem to be towards north jakarta for the brothels, but nothing towards the party spots. is there a way to minimize traffic hassle? or should i choose between staying close to the action or near the nightlife/mall/food spots? also, i heard that some hotels have ISG sponsorships - how do you check in with that info and what's the deal with the hotel staff? Looking to book at Redtop hotel again, but considering a change due to its breakfast. On my previous stays, the lounge was too small and quiet, making it awkward for guests. The only options were coffee or tea, which became repetitive during my stay. I had to eat with other guests instead of enjoying breakfast in peace. Despite this, I enjoyed walking and exploring the area. I'm curious about grab motorbike taxis, which seem to be required, and whether they provide passenger helmets, especially for rainy days. The hotel's location is convenient for those who want to explore Kota and enjoy the pool. Redtop seems like a decent option, but I'm open to other suggestions for 4-5 star hotels that offer a relaxing stay with easy excursions. I've been considering Movenpick and Holiday Inn as alternatives, with their respective pros and cons. While Redtop's club level lounge might be worth the extra price, I may not mind if it's booked, given my flexible schedule. I'm considering Redtop or Movenpick for my stay, as they're within walking distance to Classic and EMP, and I enjoy walking. However, I'm not sure if it's worth the extra cost for the club rooms at Redtop, which come with a lounge and supposedly better breakfast and evening snacks. During my previous stay at Redtop, I had some issues with the lounge, including confusion over whether the coffee was free all day, and the lounge itself being too small and quiet to entertain guests. The breakfast was also decent at first but became boring after a few days. For my next stay, I've booked a hotel further away from Classic, but I'm still open to suggestions for other 4-5 star hotels that offer a relaxing experience with minor excursions. I'm looking for a hotel where I can spend a day or three chilling by the pool, using the spa, working out, and eating without having to venture out too much. Movenpick and Holiday Inn are also options I'm considering, but I'm not sure about their pools and overall atmosphere. Additionally, I'm wondering if grab motorbike taxis in Indonesia usually provide passenger helmets. but close to Kota, maybe grab is too, doesn't really matter. I'm looking for a place that offers convenient access to both action area and nightlife scene. Hotel reasonably located between Classic and party scene I'm a young professional in my early 30s who enjoys nightlife and plans to explore tourist attractions, food options, and malls during the day. I need a non-smoking hotel room with no smoke smells, especially not through the air conditioning unit, and my budget is around \$50 USD per night. I want to know if this is realistic and whether I should prioritize location over other amenities. I also want to bring female guests back to my room at any time, and some hotels I've considered are Luminor, Movenpick, Holiday Inn Gajah Mada, Mercure, Harris Vertu, Millenium Hotel, and Grand G7 Pasar Baru. Most of these hotels seem to be located in North Jakarta, near brothels, but not close to party spots or malls. I'm looking for a solution that minimizes traffic pain and allows me to stay near the action or nightlife areas. Someone mentioned that Holiday Inn is an ISG sponsor, and if you mention your ISG username at check-in, you'll receive a Jakarta map and pricelist. I'm wondering if this is true and how to get along with hotel staff while still bringing other girls back to my room. Additionally, I have questions about BATS and its casting schedule, as well as the Malio hotel, which has a banner advertising rooms for 600,000 IDR (\$40) with free breakfast, sauna, parking, and facilities, but can't be booked online. Another user stayed at a hotel with a lounge that offered free coffee, but the receptionists would often question whether the coffee was really free, making it boring to deal with. The lounge itself is too small and quiet to entertain guests without awkwardness. Looking forward to staying at Redtop again, hoping the breakfast will be better than before I booked a lower tier room on my second stay and made my own coffee instead of using the club level service, which was decent for two days but got boring afterwards. The hotel is still in my top list, but I might consider other options like Movenpick or Holiday Inn if they meet my needs better. One thing to note is that grab motorbike taxis are required and usually come with a passenger helmet in Indonesia, so it's not necessary to bring your own. I also plan on exploring the area, and Redtop seems like a good fit for a relaxing stay. The author of this text stayed at the Redtop hotel in the Plaza club rooms and had mixed experiences. Initially, they thought the price difference between the room with a worktable and lower-tier rooms was minor, but they valued the included free coffee for working from their room. They also used the lounge to entertain visiting girls, but found it boring as there were frequent discussions about whether the coffee was really free all day. The author enjoyed the evening snack, but the lounge itself was too small and quiet for socializing. The breakfast at the Redtop hotel became monotonous after a few days, which is why they decided to book another hotel with better breakfast options. They also mentioned that walking from Redtop to Classic was not appealing due to the distance and road conditions. The author asked if grab motorbike taxis are required in Indonesia and what their policy is regarding passenger helmets. I've found Redtop hotel prices dropping down to around USD 40 per night at some booking sites, which is still a bit over my budget but might be worth considering. I've heard mixed reviews about the hotel's WiFi speed, but it worked fine for me during my two stays, and I was able to work from my room comfortably. The hotel's location is also convenient, just a 10-minute walk away from Classic. I usually prefer Airbnb for longer stays, but Redtop might be worth looking into if you're in the area. Booking.com still shows prices at \$65 for April and May, so it's worth shopping around to see what other deals are available.
