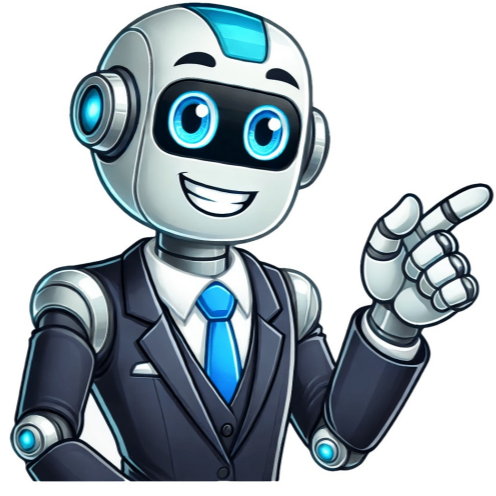

The Kenworth W900 is a line of Class 8 trucks produced by PACCAR's Kenworth division, designed primarily for highway use. Introduced in 1961, the "W" in its model designation refers to Worthington, one of the company's founders. The truck has undergone three distinct generations since its introduction in 1982 and has become a popular basis for customization among owners.The Kenworth W900's design evolution began in 1961 with the introduction of the conventional W900 model, replacing the 900-series. The new cab featured a redesigned roofline, wider radiator, and faired headlights. In subsequent years, major changes were made to the model, including the introduction of a forward-tilling fiberglass hood in 1961, a "narrow-hood" variant from 1961-1964, and a "wide hood" W900A produced from 1965-1982. The W900B was introduced in 1982, featuring bulkhead-style doors and a fiberglass roof panel.The Kenworth W900, adopting the sloped hood of the T800, was introduced in 1990 as an extended-hood variant of the W900B. Initially produced as a limited edition, it became a full-production vehicle. The W900L competed with the Peterbilt 379 and International 9300, becoming one of Kenworth's most popular models. Over time, functional changes were made to the W900B, along with powertrain upgrades to comply with emissions standards. In late 1994, the AeroCab/Aerodyne 2 was introduced as an option, featuring a raised roof and curved windscreen. The Studio Sleeper was introduced in 1998, one of the largest factory-produced sleeper cabs ever designed. In 2006, the W900S received a curved windshield option for the first time. By 2020, Kenworth began to simplify its model line, ending production of the W900S and introducing the W990 and T880S. The extended-hood W900B and W900L remain in current production, alongside the C500 and 963 off-road trucks.The T600 truck's front axle configuration led to a 25% reduction in turning radius and an over 20% decrease in fuel economy compared to the W900. To compete with its success, other manufacturers introduced aerodynamically enhanced Class 8 highway trucks like the Ford Aeromax, International 9400, and Peterbilt 377 by the late 1980s. The T600 was replaced by the Kenworth T660 in 2008-2017, which shared a cab/sleeper commonality with its predecessor. The introduction of the VIT package for luxurious models like the W900 offered diamond-tufted interiors and extra features for driving comfort and convenience. This luxury model eventually expanded to normal sleepers and day cabs. In 1976, the VIT-200 was introduced as the first Aerodyne sleeper truck with raised roofs and vista windows. Later models featured either Splendor or VIT interiors, sometimes in combination. The Liberty Editions were dark blue trucks with red and white stripes, full VIT interiors, and large sleepers, available on both the K100E and W900B from 1986 to 1987. A W900B appeared in the James Bond movie Licence to Kill in 1989, prompting Kenworth to create a "007 Limited Edition" option package featuring gold-plated parts, marking the introduction of the "Extended Hood" option.The Kenworth W900 has been a highly sought-after model in both the film and television industries. Its appearances on screen have often brought attention to its unique design and features. One notable instance of this is in the 1977 movie Smokey and the Bandit, where the W900 was featured alongside the Pontiac Trans Am. The film showcased three W900s driven by Jerry Reed, with two being from 1974.The model's connection to James Bond is also significant, as seen in the 1989 film Licence to Kill. A limited edition of the W900B was released to commemorate this occasion. In addition to its appearances on screen, the Kenworth W900 has been featured in various television shows such as Movin' On, Ice Road Truckers, and C'est pas sorcier.The model's influence extends beyond the entertainment industry, with a limited edition of the ICON900 being released on its 25th anniversary. This special edition came with nearly the entire catalog of chrome "brightwork" and unique badges to distinguish it from standard models. A photograph shows the cross-section of a Portuguese-grown kiwifruit.West Fourth Street originates from Sixth Avenue, where it merges with other streets like West Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, and Thirteenth Streets in Greenwich Village's confusing network. This street boasts a standard width of 40 feet between curbside lanes, accommodating two-lane traffic and one center lane going eastbound. However, the segment spanning Seventh to Eighth Avenues runs westbound, reflecting an original grid pattern that differs from the norm, measuring about 35 feet in width. The section bordering Washington Square Park's southern edge is designated as Washington Square South for its four-block stretch from MacDougal Street to University Place.Initially named Asylum Street after the Orphan Asylum Society, West Fourth Street was renamed following the demolition of the asylum in 1833. This change led to the rechristening of adjacent streets, creating the current naming inconsistency within Greenwich Village's layout. The Washington Square Methodist Church, situated near Washington Square Park's southwest corner, stands out as a Romanesque Revival marble structure built between 1859 and 1860 by Gamaliel King. It gained notoriety for its support of anti-war activists during the Vietnam War era.The West Fourth Street subway station, located at Sixth Avenue, serves as a major transfer point within the New York City Subway system, hosting multiple train lines (A, B, C, D, E, F, , and M). Nearby lies the "Cage," an outdoor basketball court that has hosted numerous citywide tournaments. Historically significant locations along West Fourth Street include The Mad Hatter, a village institution serving as an intellectual gathering spot, and the Golden Swan bar, known for its literary connections to Eugene O'Neill's play "The Iceman Cometh." Gertrude Vanderbilt Whitney established the Whitney Studio Club in 1918, a hub for young artists to showcase their work. The facility operated for ten years, laying groundwork for what became the Whitney Museum of American Art. Notable artists like John Sloan and Edward Hopper got their start there. The street became a hotspot for folk music, with Gerde's Folk City hosting Bob Dylan and Simon & Garfunkel in 1961.
