Paige, born Saraya Jade Bevis, is a British professional wrestler and actress, signed to All Elite Wrestling (AEW). Paige also appeared on Total Divas, a reality TV show, where she explored her sexuality and was once engaged to Jose Rodriguez. ### Paige signed with WWE in 2011 and began wrestling as part of its developmental system. Born and raised in Norwich, Norfolk, Paige is the daughter of professional wrestlers Ian Bevis and Julia Hamer-Bevis. Despite initially being scared of wrestling due to injuries her family suffered, she began training at around age 10 or 11, eventually making her debut as a wrestler at 13. Roy Bevis made his Frontier Wrestling Alliance (FWA) debut in 2002, winning an FWA All-England title match against several opponents. Over the next few years, Bevis traded the title with other FWA stars, but ultimately vacated it due to injury. After a stint in prison for drink-driving and dangerous driving, Bevis returned to wrestling in independent promotions in the UK, including his father's World Association of Wrestling (WAW). In 2006, Bevis won the Real Deal Wrestling Heavyweight Championship and later went on to win the WAW World Heavyweight Championship, becoming the first British wrestler to hold the title. He successfully defended it several times before losing it to Scott Fusion in 2010. Bevis regained the title a few months later and held it until March 2012, when he lost it again, this time to Danny Boy Collins in a Hardcore Tag Team match. Bevis has since adopted the ring name Roy Knight and formed a tag team with his brother Zak Knight as the UK Hooligans. The duo won the HEW Tag Team Championship in 2011 and later defeated Army of Two to claim the vacant RQW European Tag Team Championship in September 2012. Bevis comes from a professional wrestling family, with his father Ricky Knight and stepmother Sweet Saraya being part of it as well. His half-brother Zak and sister Saraya Jade are also wrestlers, while Saraya Jade currently competes under the ring name Saraya for AEW. The Knights run their own promotion, World Association of Wrestling (WAW), and starred in a Channel 4 documentary called The Wrestlers: Fighting with My Family in July 2012. Bevis has three children and his eldest son Ricky Knight Jr is also a professional wrestler. In January 2022, he became a grandfather for the first time after RKJ's child was born. Bevis has had a troubled past, serving nine-month jail sentence for drunk driving in September 2004. He was also arrested multiple times, including for affray and possessing an offensive weapon. In August 2005, Bevis was involved in a match where he knocked a referee unconscious after being given a red card. Throughout his career, Bevis has held numerous titles, including the All Star Wrestling British Tag Team Championship, European Catch Tour Association ECTA Tag Team Championship, FWA All-England Championship, and WAW World Heavyweight Championship, among others. Roy Knight is a wrestler who has had a successful career in various promotions including WAW. He has won multiple championships such as the British Cruiserweight Championship (1 time) and the World Tag Team Championship (6 times), often teaming up with other wrestlers like the Canary Kid, Hot Stuff, Ricky Knight Jr., Zak Knight, and Roy Knight himself. Knight's family is also involved in wrestling, with his son and grandson being part of the industry as well. He has been involved in various notable promotions including AEW and WWE through his connection to Paige (Saraya), who shared her experiences about private videos being leaked online. Paige Talks About Past Controversy, Teases Possible Return to Wrestling The 32-year-old wrestler recently spoke candidly about the incident in an interview with TV Insider, saying she doesn't regret what happened. She attributes her growth as a person to the experience, but acknowledges the pain it caused her. Paige also discussed how the leaked private videos continue to affect her nearly eight years later, stating that fans might never forget the incident. Despite this, she says she's moved on and is working towards a possible return to wrestling, teasing fans with hints on social media. Paige's future in wrestling remains uncertain, with speculation surrounding a potential return to the WWE. While she has hinted at considering a comeback, fans are more interested in knowing whether she'll re-sign with WWE or explore opportunities elsewhere, such as All Elite Wrestling (AEW). Paige has been actively promoting her Twitch account, which has gained significant followings. Recently, on Twitch, she revealed details about her contract, stating it expires in June 2024, leaving her uncertain about WWE's willingness to extend it. This raises questions about her future with the company, as she is not medically cleared for wrestling activities. Paige's situation may draw parallels to Daniel Bryan's move to AEW, where he cited Vince McMahon's overprotectiveness as a factor. As a result, Paige may weigh her options, potentially considering WWE or another promotion like AEW.
