Cyclists encountered significant difficulties, including the Col des fourches, Col de Toute, Cie de Saint Anastaise, and Col de Superbesse.A total of 5,568 participants took part in the event, with 4,550 finishing successfully. Weather conditions were unfavorable at the start, with rain, but improved later in the day to become ideal for cycling. Famous athletes such as Ayrton Prost and Philippe Alliot participated in this edition.Frdric Bessy emerged victorious among men, while Laure Russias took home the prize for women. The Etape du Tour had its second edition on Thursday, July 14th, 1994, starting in Lourdes and finishing at Luz-Ardiden in the Pyrenees region. This event saw a total of 4,456 participants, with 2,454 finishers, across a challenging 160-kilometer course that included four mountain passes: the Col de Peyresourde, Col d'Aspin, Col du Tourmalet, and Col de Luz-Ardiden. The race was not without its issues; congestion in the valley and on the climb to Luz-Ardiden were significant problems due to poor organization.In a particularly difficult edition that drew three times as many registrations as the previous year, local coordination and staff volunteers struggled to keep up with demand. This led to last-minute changes at the starting line just two hours before the actual start of the race.Despite these challenges, competitors found the experience rewarding. Herv Coubrges, jersey number 1712, credited the Etape du Tour for sparking his interest in cycling, and Tsen Seong Moong, a Malaysian rider with jersey number 44, discovered his passion for cycling during this event.In contrast to the second edition, the first Etape du Tour took place on Tuesday, July 20th, 1993. It started in Tarbes and finished in Pau, covering a distance of 190 kilometers through the Pynes regions. This inaugural event had its own set of challenges, including misty conditions at the start and cold temperatures during the climbs over the Col du Tourmalet, Col du Soulor, and Col de l'Aubisque.The race saw an impressive number of participants, with 1,705 cyclists starting and 1,385 finishing in the Place Royale in Pau. This first edition was notable for its short preparation time, being organized from start to finish in just three months. It also marked a beginning for riders like Christophe Rinero, who would later achieve fame by placing fourth in the 1998 Tour de France.Overall, both editions of the Etape du Tour demonstrated their capacity to inspire and challenge cyclists alike, with winners like Igor Pavlov (men) and Brigitte Kerlouet (women) achieving success on the first day and Christophe Rinero winning the inaugural event, as well as Maryse Simon in the women's category.

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
