The average annual salary for a tour guide at the US Capitol is between \$49K and \$91K, with opportunities to earn up to \$242,500 per year. Tour guides provide information and assistance during guided tours. In Washington, DC, the mean hourly cost of a highlights tour is \$45, with prices ranging from \$0 to \$70 for a minimum of four hours. To work as a licensed tour guide in DC, one must possess knowledge of the city's history, cultural nuances, and transportation systems. A license is required to guide or escort groups, which can be obtained by applying for the Sightseeing Guide License with necessary documentation. To become a tour guide in the US, a high school diploma is typically required, along with courses in areas like speech, communications, art, sociology, anthropology, political science, and foreign languages. Postsecondary training in the travel industry is also available from professional schools and colleges. The tour industry offers various programs for individuals interested in becoming a guide, including training and job placement services that last between nine and twelve months. Some students may also participate in part-time field trips to gain hands-on experience. The regulation regarding tour guide licenses is currently being reviewed by an appeals court.
